Mr. Dimick recommended that this work be started on (A) Street between 3d and 4th. Streets. On motion, seconded and carried John Stuve was selected to serve as foreman on this work, subject to the recommendations of the Street Committee. On motion, seconded and carried the Council went on record favoring State dispensary for liquor of more than 14 % alcohol. There being no further business the Council then adjourned.

Special Meeting

A special meeting was held Dec. 1st. at 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present, Mayor Vinyard, Atty. Wait, Recorder Fosmark, Chief of Police Lent, and Councilmen Bates, Cutsforth, Dimick, Graham, Hornig Meeks Porter and Thompson.

Mayor Vinyard stated that the meeting had been called to consider the bids and award the contracts, after comparing bids it was found that D.P. Slater was low bidder on General contract and Canby Hdw. Co. on steel pipe. The award on pumping unit to be made on the basis of suitability and efficiency as well as price.

It was now moved by Meeks and seconded by Hornig that all bids be rejected. After some discussion this motion was withdrawn with the consent of its second. It was then moved, seconded and carried that the bid of the Canby Hardware & Implement Co. on Matheson steel pipe for the sum of \$ 1640.90 be accepted. The General contract on the reservoir and Pump house was now discussed at length, there being a difference of opinion regarding the possibility of having a sound foundation upon which these units could be built, it was decided to hold this matter over until a closer study of this condition could be made. Mayor Vinyard requested that all Councilmen meet at the springs on Sunday Dec. 5th at 10 o'clock A.M. to look the situation over.

On motion, seconded and carried the bid of M. Donald Spencer to furnish an American-Marsh Pumping unit for the sum of \$402.00 was accepted.

R.M. Wade & Co. stated that they could furnish a used Chlorinator for about \$450.00 they were asked to gather full particulars regarding this machine and report to the Council later.

There being no further business the Council then adjourned.
