Regular Meeting January 3, 1933

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday,

January 3, 1933, the first Monday being a holiday.
On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, Atty Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Evans, and Councilmen Bates, Cutsforth, Dimick, Graham, Hornig, Meeks, Porter and Thompson.

The Mayor and newly elected councilmen having taken the oath of

office, the meeting was called to order.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Communications.

Applications from Frank Kendall and John Stuwe for the job of nightwatchman, resignation of Fred Larson as Fire-Chief and letter from the Secretary of the League of Oregon Cities, announcing the annual meeting to be held at Salem on January 9 and 10, were read by the Recorder.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 8-nays 0

Reports.

Supt. Lent reported that the water tank was being painted and renovated, arrangements having been made with the S.P.Co. to use their tank if necessary, while the work was going on. In connection with this, Councilman Bates stated that in his opinion, a coat of varnish should be added at this time, which would prolong the life of the tank, and on motion, seconded and carried, this was so voted.

Fire Chief Larson made a short verbal report for the past year stating that there had been no fires of any importance within the City limits, but again calling the attention of the council to the need of a

new apparatus.

Mr. Dimick reported having examined the building adjacent to the G.W.White property on First Street, and recommended that the owner, C.E.Wait of Newport, Oregon be notified to either repair or remove same. The Recorder was instructed to advise Mr. Wait of this action.

Mr. Dimick also bro't up the matter of unemployment, which had been

more or less put up to the road bosses, by the County Court.

He stated that free dirt could be obtained from several places in the City, which could be used in filling in around the pump-house, thereby furnishing some work for unemployed. The matter was left to Mr. Dimick as Chairman of Streets and Public Property.

Mr. Lent vaulenteeres to assept a reduction of 10% in his salary

as Supt. of the Light and Water Departments, also that he would pay

for the light and water used at his residence.

Whereupon Mayor Dedman made a short report regarding the financial condition of the City, showing that there was no indebtedness and the valuation of the water and light plants to be about \$70,000.00.

He urged more cooperation among the members of the Council and Committees in the management of the various city affairs.
