The attorney stated further that if someone should sell beer without a license, a Circuit Court injunction could be gotten out to stop them. There being no other business, the Council then adjourned.

Special Meeting
April 13, 1933.

A special meeting of the Council was called on April 13, 1933. at 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present Mayor Dedman, City attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark, and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Hornig, Meeks, and Porter, absent Cutsforth, Dimick and Thompson.

The Mayor announced that the meeting was being held for the purpose of transferring money from the Water & Light Sinking Fund to the Road Fund, Whereupon the following Ordinance was introduced, and on motion, seconded and carried was passed on its first reading and ordered published:

Ordinance No. 55

An Ordinance providing for the transfer of the sum of Four Hundred Dollars, from the Water & Light Sinking Fund of the City of Canby, to the General Road Fund of Canby, and directing the City Treasurer of Canby to make the transfer.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS;

SECTION 1-

That the sum of Four Hundred Dollars be transferred from the Water & Light Sinking Fund of Canby, to the General Road Fund of Canby.

SECTION 2- That the City Treasurer of Canby be hereby directed to make the transfer as herein directed.

SECTION 3- WHEREAS, it is deemed to be best, for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of Canby, an emergency is hereby declared, and this Ordinance shall become immediately in force and operation upon its passage by the Council and its approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time April 13, 1933, and ordered published, and to come up for final passage at the regular meeting of the Council, May 1, 1933.

The Mayor urged that the committees co-operate more fully and make an earnest effort to estimate the cost of all work to be done before proceeding with same.

The License Ordinance relating to Junk and Second hand dealers, was then discussed. Mr. Porter suggested that provisions be made whereby all Second hand dealers be required to keep record of all merchandise purchased.

After some discussion it was decided that owing to the economic conditions the Junk and Second Hand Stores be permitted to operate without the payment of the License fee as provided by Ordinance.

There being no other business, the Council then adjourned.
