An ordinance fixing the rates to be charged the users of Electric Light, Power and Heat furnished by the Electric Light and Power system of Canby, Oregon, and repealing all ordinances heretofore passed, which conflicks with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section IV.—This ordinance hereby repeals all former ordinances passed regulating or effecting the rates of the City of Canby, Oregon, Light and Power System, so far as they conflict with the provissions of this ordinance.
