

SPECIAL MEETING

A special meeting of the City Council was held Friday evening June 23, 1933 at 7:30 O'clock. On roll call there were present Mayor Dedman, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark, and Councilmen Bates, Cutsforth, Graham, Hornig, and Meeks. Porter and Thompson reported later.

Mayor Dedman stated that the meeting had been called to discuss means of securing a new water supply for the City. Councilman Bates reported that the springs at the Dan Salomon place had been looked over and the supply of water determined to be sufficient, he suggested that tests of the water be made and that an Engineer be employed to look over the project and give estimate of cost of installing the plant.

Mr. Meeks stated that some preliminary work could be done before the services of an Engineer was necessary, this work would consist of cleaning the springs up and connecting them together so that their actual flow could be determined, and tests of the water made. After some discussion it was moved, seconded and carried that Supt. Lent be authorized to employ men to clean out and connect the springs together and have tests made of the water. Mr. Eid stated that it would be necessary to have an Engineers report and blue prints of the project before an application for a Federal loan be made. Whereupon the Recorder was instructed to write

Floyd W. Allen Engineer Railway exchange Bldg. Portland Ore. to determine if his services would be available. The Recorder was also instructed to write State Board of Health for data giving a comparison of the liability of contamination between spring and well water.

Coronel Aird now read a report on the proposed project of placing a dam across the Willamette River at Rock Island thereby making it possible to install a Hydro Electric plant at this point, also raising the water level of the Mollala River to 20 feet at Canby. Thereby enabling boats and barges to serve the City from a proposed terminal here, the tonnage available at this terminal being 66,816 tons incoming and 72,950 tons outgoing. A lake of 7,000 acres would be made near the mouth of the Mollala River, the better farms being protected by dykes and the others would be purchased and be permitted to flood. Irrigation for adjacent land would also be available. Mr. Aird stated that the Government engineers had reported favorable on this project and urged the City to work for it in view of the possibilities of securing electric energy and transportation facilities at rates much less than the present cost.

There being no further business the Council adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING June 30, 1933

A special meeting of the Council was held Friday evening at 8 O'clock. On roll call there were present Mayor Dedman, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Fosmark and Councilmen Bates, Cutsforth, Hornig, Porter and Thompson. Graham reported later. absent Meeks and Dimick.

Mayor Dedman stated that the meeting had been called for the purpose of consulting Mr. Salomon regarding taking an option on a portion of land around the springs. Mr. Bates stated that Mr. Salomon disposed of his property on which the springs are situated but had reserved one acre and the right-away for a road leading to the springs, which would be available for the City. Mr. Salomon being present stated that his price for the one acre of land surrounding the springs and the right-away for a road and the pipe line, would be \$1,500.00 but if the Council thought this price too high he would be willing to have a committee selected to work out a definite price. It appearing to the Council that the price was too high, it was moved, seconded and carried that a committee be appointed to derive a price and to take an option on the property. Mayor Dedman appointed Mr. Bates to serve on this committee. Mr. Salomon was to appoint a man and they in turn were to appoint a third man. said committee were to report at the regular meeting of the Council on July third. There being no further business the Council adjourned.
