Whereupon on motion, the following Resolution was introduced, and being seconded and carried, declared adopted:

#### RESOLUTION.

RESOLVED by the City Council of Canby, Oregon, at its regular session on the evening of Sept. 6, 1932.

WHEREAS, the City Council of Canby has made careful inquiry into the facts surrounding the death by accident, at Canby, of Erle Bowlsby, regular nightwatchman of Canby, on the night of March 24, 1932, when struck by a Southern Pacific Railway train, while he was in the act of crossing the said Southern Pacific Railway track near the depot in Canby;

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of Canby, that the said Erle

Bowlsby at the time said accident occurred was acting in the full discharge of his duty as nightwatchman, and as said duties had been and were expected to be performed by said Erle Bowlsby to the regulations and satisfaction of the

City Council of Canby; and,
WHEREAS, the claim of Harriet Bowlsby, widow of the said Erle Bowlsby has been denied and refused by the State Ind. Accident Commission, and believing the action of the said Commission to be wrong in the matter, we ask that said Commission give the claimant Harriet Bowlsby, a re-hearing in the matter, and we hereby instruct the City Attorney of Canby to furnish Mrs. Bowlsby, such assistance as may be necessary to obtain a re-hearing of the matter and to assist her in securing the compensation which wee believe she is entitled to under the circumstances in this case, and the Workman's Compensation Law of the State of Oregon.

There being no other business, the Council then adjourned.

Regular Meeting. Octo. 3-1932

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, Octo.

3, 1932 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Bates, Dimick, Graham, Meeks, Patch, Porter and Thompson. Councilman Koehler reported later. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

### Communications.

The Recorder read communications from J. L. Franzen, Secretary of the League of Oregon Cities, and from Philip A. Parsons, Director of Bureau of Social Research, University of Oregon, announcing a meeting of the League at Eugene on October 13 and 14, and expressing the wish that Canby be represented. No action, except that the Mayor stated that it would be a good thing if some one could attend.

Whereupon, Mr. Eugene Blazer being present, Mayor Dedman asked him to address the Council regarding his intentions with respect to the open ditches left by the Canby Rivers Irrigation Company.

Mr. Blazer stated that it was the intention to install pipes as soow

as wet weather came on, and it could be done without too much nuisance.

#### Reports.

Supt. Lent reported having connected up two new water customers. Also that he expected to clean the tank on Thursday night, Octo. 6, and that water would be shut off from about eight to twelve, and that water pipe lines would be flushed thoroughly.

In connection with this, a Mr. Santo being present, stated that the water tank needed scraping and painting, which would help eliminate

offensive odors, and offered to do the job for \$ 350.00.

Mr. Lent suggested that members of the Council vist the works on Thurs. day night, while tank was empty.

City Attorney Wait spoke of the coming election, that he would prepare the necessary notices and that filings should be made at least ten days before election day.

Mr. Dimick reported having oiled roads with the use of the County

equipment, thereby saving considerable money for the City.

Mr. Patch reported that his committee had met with P.E.P. officials regarding cheaper rate for the City. It was intimated that there might be some reduction worked out, but in the meantime the City could work under the present contract, which after its expiration, could be discontinued under proper notice.

Mr. Strickland of the Molalla Electric Company expressed his will-

ingness to meet with the Committee and discuss the matter at any time.

Whereupon the question of free water service for the Canby Womens Civic building was bro't up by Mr. Cattley. After some discussion the Council decided to grant this concession until the privilege should be

abused. The City Treasurer then read his reports covering the various funds for the period ending Sept. 30. The same having been audited by the Finance Committee, were accepted and ordered made a part of these minutes

Fire Chief Larson called the attention of the Council to the bad fire hazards in the City, especially the conditions surrounding the buil-

ding between the G.W. White residence and Krueger Bros. store.

Mayor Dedman suggested that the proper committee look after this . J. R. Vinyard again bro't up the matter of poor drainage at his business corner, asking that something be done to correct the condition before the rainy season set in. This was also left to the Street Committee and Mr. Koehler to work out a plan.
