## November 7-1932

The Council met in regular session on Monday, November 7, 1932 at the usual hour.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, Atty. Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H. B. Evans, and Councilmen Bates, Dimick, Graham, Koehler, Meeks, Patch, Porter and Thompson.

The minutes of the previous regular meeting and those of the special meeting of October 24 were read and approved. Whereupon the Recorder read a communication from Messrs. McNeil and Raymond offering for sale two Diesel engines for the purpose of generting electric energy for the City. No action.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above claims were allowed.

Whereupon Mr. M. G. Ellis addressed the Council, asking for an additional street light back of the Stefani lumber yard, and more particularly for the benefit of the Bethany Church. Referred to Light Com.

## Reports.

Supt. Lent reported that the water tank had been cleaned, and that since then no complaints of the water had been made.

Fire Chief Larson reported the purchase of two new fire ladders, the same having been received. Also called the attention of the Council to the fact that boys were making a habit of congregating in the old Randall warehouse, thereby creating a dangerous hazard.

Whereupon the matter of painting the water tank was taken up, and

this was left to the water committee with power to act.
Mr. Hornig reported a bad condition at 5th and E streets, caused by the settling of the dirt where ditch had been filled in. Referred to Chr. Dimick of the Street Committee.

Whereupon there again arose a warm discussion about the conditions at the Vinyard corner during heavy rains, and on motion, seconded and carried, it was voted to ask Mr. Koehler to make changes in his gutter in frontof garage, the City to meet the expense.

Whereupon was presented a certain agreement bewteen the Molalla Electric Co. and the City, relative to the use of each others poles, and on motion, seconded and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to sign and return to the Company for their signatures.

The following Ordinance was then introduced, and on motion, seconded and carried, declared passed on first reading and ordered published:

## ORDINANCE NO 52

An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax upon all the taxable property, both real and personal, within the Corporate limits of Canby.

Canby Does Ordain as Follows,
SECTION ONE—The Council of the City of Canby, does hereby levy a tax of \$3485.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the Corporate limits of Canby, and which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Sheriff and tax collector of Clackamas. County, Oregon, during the year 1933, with the taxes known as the taxes of 1932. SECTION TWO—Said levy shall consist of \$2855.00 known as the regular City tax, and \$630.00, Special Bond Fund No. One, heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.

Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council held on November 7th, 1932, and ordered published.
