

Regular Meeting
Dec. 5-1932

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, December 5, 1932 at the usual hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present : Mayor Dedman, Atty Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder Evans and Councilmen Bates, Dimick, Graham, Koehler, Meeks, Porter and Thompson. Absent Patch.

The minutes of the previous meeting of November 7 and those of the special meeting of November 10 were read and approved.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above claims were allowed.

Reports.

Supt. Lent reported having made arrangements with the So. Pacific Co to use their water tank while the City tank was being renovated, which work he expected to start in a day or two.

He also stated that the light which Mr. Ellis had asked for to be placed near the Bethany Church did not seem to be necessary, and had been disallowed by the Committee.

Mr. Bates reported that the State Ind. Acc. Commission had again acted unfavorably in the Bowlsby case, and it seemed to be the opinion of the Council that suit should be bro't. Attorney Wait stated that he thought the Bowlsby estate had a good case. Mr. Bates said that he would interview Attorney Jack of Oregon City as to procedure in bringing action.

Whereupon the matter of delinquent water and light bills coming up, Mr. Bates suggested that they should be bro't to the attention of the Council at each regular meeting.

Whereupon Mr. Grant White asked that the Committee on Streets and Public Property inspect the building adjoining his property on First Street with the idea of taking some action, as the building was in a very bad state of repair..

The following Ordinance then came up for final action, and on motion, seconded and carried, declared adopted. Yeas 7-Nays 0.

ORDINANCE NO 52
An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax upon all the taxable property, both real and personal, within the Corporate limits of Canby.
Canby Does Ordain as Follows,
SECTION ONE—The Council of the City of Canby, does hereby levy a tax of \$3485.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the Corporate limits of Canby, and which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Sheriff and tax collector of Clackamas County, Oregon, during the year 1933, with the taxes known as the taxes of 1932.
SECTION TWO—Said levy shall consist of \$2855.00 known as the regular City tax, and \$630.00, Special Bond Fund No. One, heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.
Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council held on November 7th, 1932, and ordered published.
To come up for final hearing at a regular meeting of the Council on December 5th, 1932.
