Whereupon the matter of the nightwatchman coming up, on motion, seconded and carried it was voted that he be paid by the City, the sum of \$ 75.00 per month, and that there be no private protection .

The following Ordinance was then introduced, and on motion, seconded and carried, passed on its first reading and to come up for final action, on March 7, after being legally published in the Canby Herald.

ORDINANCE NO. 48

An Ordinance to purchase a strip of land at the North end of "B" Street, Canby, Oregon, where the said "B" Street intersects the County Road running North from Canby to the Willamette River, for the purpose of straightening "B" Street from

where it intersects said County Road. CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Whereas the City Council of Canby believes it to be proper and to the best interests of Canby to straighten out the curve in "B" Street where the North end of "B" Street intersects the County Road running North from Canby to the Willamette River, by purchasing a strip of land on the East side of "B" Street where "B" Street intersects said County Road, therefore:

Section 2. Canby proposes to and hereby does purchase of Wilhelmina Wait, the necessary land for that purpose, said land being described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the point where the East line of "B" Street, Canby, Oregon, intersects the East line of the County Road running North from Canby to the Willamette

River, and known as the Ferry Road, running thence South fifteen rods to a point where said line intersects the present East line of "B" Street, Canby, thence North along the present East line of "B" Street to the point of beginning, being a curved piece of land of the Wilhelmina Wait property, said above described land to be used for the purpose of straightening "B" Street, Canby, from the point where it intersects said County Road.

Section 3. It is proposed to pay the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars for the above described land, to be used for the above stated purpose.

Passed on first reading Monday, February 1, 1932, at a regular meeting of the City council.

Regular Monthly Meeting March 7, 1932

The regular monthly meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, March 7, 1932 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Bates, Dimick, Graham, Koehler, Meeks, Patch and Porter. Absent-Thompson.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Whereupon the Recorder read a communication from the State Board of Health regarding the appointment of a health officer. This matter was turned over to the City Attorney for consideration as to requirements in regard to same.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported electric line change at the Wait property and hydrant change at the Geo. Koehler corner.

Fire Chief Larson reported having received letter of thanks from the Aurora Fire Department for making the run to Aurora at the time of the Yoder fire.

Mr. Koehler for the Light and Water Committee reported the well having been cleaned and the flow of water now satisfactory.

Mr. Dimick reported work done on the river road and Cemetery road, and some dragging on the Weygandt road. Also suggested and recommended that some improvement should be made, in connection with the County, on road running from the S.P. tracks in to and adjacent to the Kronberg property.

The Council was favorable to the suggestion and he was told to go ahead.

City Treasurer Eid recommended that in order to replenish the Road Fund, two warrants of \$ 300 each be drawn in favor of the Water and Light Sinking Fund, registered for interest and the money be deposited in the Road Fund. So ordered.

<p>ORDINANCE NO. 49</p> <p>An ordinance amending ordinance No. 30, passed by the City Council of Canby on September 4, 1928, fixing the charges for water passing through the mains in the city of Canby, Oregon, by repealing so much of Section One of said ordinance as fixes the residential rates for water, and substituting therefore the following residential rates for water passing through meters in Canby, Oregon.</p>	<p>CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:</p> <p>Section 1.—That hereafter the residential rates for water passing through meters in Canby shall be as follows:</p> <p>Minimum charge \$1.25</p> <p>First 400 cubic feet 1.25</p> <p>Next 600 cub. ft. 20c per 100 cub. ft.</p> <p>Next 500 cub. ft. 10c per 100 cub. ft.</p> <p>Next 500 cub. ft. 8c per 100 cub. ft.</p> <p>Balance 6c per cub. ft.</p> <p>Section 2.—That so much of Section One of an ordinance passed by the City Council of Canby on September 4, 1928, fixing the rates for water passing through the meters in Canby, as refers to residential rates, be, and is hereby repealed.</p> <p>Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the City Council held on March 7th, 1932, and ordered published, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the City Council on April 4, 1932.</p> <p>H.
