ORDINANCE NO. 51

An Ordinance Appropriating the Sum of \$150.00 for the Purpose of Paying for Land Used and Necessary for the Improving and Straightening of "B" Street, Camby, Oregon. CANBY DOES ORDAIN, as follows: That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be, and the same hereby is appropriated from the general fund of the City of Canby, Oregon to be paid to Wilhelmina Wait for the hereinafter described land to be used in the improving and straightening of "B" Street, Canby, at and near where it intersects the Ferry Road running from Canby to the Willamette River. The land purchased is described as

from Canby to the Willamette River.

The land purchased is described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at the point where the East line of "B" Street, Canby, Oregon, intersects the East line of the County Road running North from Canby to the Willamette River, and known as the Ferry Road; running thence South fifteen rods to a point where said line intersects the present East line of "B" Street, Canby; thence North along the present East line of "B" Street to the place

of beginning, being a curved piece of land off of the West line of the Wilhelmina Wait land, situate in Section 33-3 South of Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in the Town of Canby, County of Clackamas and State of Oregon; said above described land to be used for the purpose of straightening "B" Street, Canby, from the point where it intersects

said County Road.
