

Regular Meeting
June 6-1932

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, June 6, 1932 shortly after 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Bates, Dimick, Graham, Koehler, Meeks, Porter and Thompson. Absent, Mayor Dedman and Councilman Patch.

President of the Council Graham called the meeting to order, but Mayor Dedman appeared shortly and took the chair.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Communications.

One from the Secretary of the League of Oregon Cities, enclosing certain proposed bills to come before the next Legislature, and inviting comments.

On motion, seconded and carried it was voted to lay these over until some future meeting.

Also communication from Milo Lee, in which Mr. Lee offered his services to complete the deep well and bring in an artesian flow of water for \$ 2000 plus \$ 500 expense money. Referred to Water Committee.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above claims were allowed.
Yeas 7-Nays 0.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported that there was plenty of water in the deep well, which was clear at first pumping, but gradually became milky, and the bad scent was still noticeable.

Mr. Larson reported that the Fire Department needed at least 300 feet of new hose, and on motion of Bates, seconded by Dimick and carried, the Committee on Fire and Water was instructed to purchase that amount of hose.

He also reported the necessity of mowing grass on vacant lots and this matter was left to Com. on Streets and Public Property.

In the matter of street signs, Mr. Bates estimated that the City would require about sixty eight, and the approximate cost would be \$ 60.00.

This was left to Committee on Streets and Public Property to report.

Whereupon on motion of Graham, seconded and carried, a red light for the benefit of the nightwatchman and traffic police was ordered installed at the Cattley corner.

Whereupon Mr. M. G. Ellis addressed the Council asking for improvement on road leading to the Knight's bridge, and this was left for the attention of the Street Committee.

June 6-continued.

The following Resolution was then introduced and on motion, seconded and carried, declared adopted:

RESOLUTION.

A Resolution declaring the intention of the City Council of Canby, to pass an Ordinance declaring the charter of the Molalla Rivers Irrigation Company forfeited and declaring null and void their permit to operate their water plant through the streets of Canby.

WHEREAS; The Canby Rivers Irrigation Co. has failed to carry out their agreement to furnish water for irrigation purposes to property adjacent to their line of irrigation ditches in and adjacent to Canby, as provided in the Charter granted to them by the City of Canby, and

WHEREAS, said Charter contained a provision, that in the event that said Irrigation Company shall fail or neglect to operate it's said irrigation ditches through Canby, or fail or neglect to furnish said water for the period of one year, said City of Canby had the right and power to declare said Charter null and void, and to repeal said Charter,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, ~~that~~ by the City Council of Canby that by reason of the failure and neglect of said Molalla Rivers Irrigation Co. to operate for more than one year their said plant and furnish water as set forth in their Charter, that the said Canby Rivers Irrigation Company has forfeited it's said Charter and it's right to operate under said Charter thorough the City of Canby, and that the City Council of the City of Canby proposes at the next regular meeting on July 5, 1932 to introduce a City Ordinance declaring forfeited and null and void the Charter under which said Canby Rivers Irrigation Company was privileged to operate it's system and conduct it's water through the streets of Canby.

A copy of the above Resolution was ordered sent to the Canby Rivers Irrigation Company.

Whereupon J. R. Vinyard asked the Council to do something regarding the lack of drainage at B and First streets, and the matter was left to the Street Committee to recommend what in their opinion would be the logical way to remedy the situation.

Whereupon a representative from Fairbanks, Morse and Co. addressed the Council regarding the generating of electric power by Diesel Engine, and it was left to the Electric Light and Water Committee for their consideration

Whereupon Mrs. W. H. Thompson, Chairman of the School Board of # 86 addressed the Council relative to an accident to water pipes at the school house, thereby creating an unusually large consumption of water, and asking for some reduction of the bills. No action.

There being no other business, on motion, seconded and carried, the Council adjourned.
