On motion, seconded and carried, the above claims were allowed. Yeas 8 nays 0.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported the Watson electric line completed; also that a light had been installed at the Ed. Shull corner; also that the pump was now in good shape and the noise eliminated. He asked of the Council the privilege of ordering a spare transformer, the same being granted.

Mr. Larson made a verbal report, stating that there had been no fires in the City during the year, but that the Department had been called out six times for grass fires, etc. He asked the Council to consider the matter of calling a special election for the purpose of voting on the matter of a special levy to start a sinking fund to be used in purchasing new equipment. He also suggested that an alarm system be installed, asked for 200 feet of $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch hose, some kind of a light to be used on truck, and that the telephone in City Hall might be moved to his residence. These matters were referred to Committee.

The City Treasurer read his reports covering the last quarter and also his annual report for 1930. The same having been audited by the Finance Committee, on motion, seconded and carried, were accepted and ordered spread on the minutes. (Reports follow in these minutes.)

Mayor Dedman made a short report, with figures secured from the Treasurer, showing outstanding bonds of only \$ 5000, and asked the earnest support of the Council during the coming year. He then appointed the following committees:

On motion, seconded and carried, the office of Street Commissioner was declared vacant.

Whereupon, the Recorder was instructed to write the Southern Pacific Co. with regard to the deplorable condition of "C" street adjacent to the R. R. crossing, and ask for repairs to be made.

Whereupon Mr. Lent asked for instructions concerning a certain bill of some \$ 14.00 which was unpaid by a light consumer, but guaranteed by Mr. Stefani. He was ordered to disconnect the power until bill was paid.

Whereupon Mr. C. M. Tuekett, being present, asked the Council for an extension of the city water main to his property, requiring about 1200 feet of pipe laid. Referred to Water Committee.

The Committee appointed to confer with Mr. Griffith regarding power rates was continued.
