

## Regular Meeting

Febr. 2-1931

The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, Febr. 2, 1931 at the usual hour.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Bates, Dimick, Graham, Koehler, Meeks, Patch, Porter and Thompson.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Whereupon the Recorder read a communication from the Secretary of the League of Oregon Cities, asking the Council to go on record as favoring certain bills introduced in the Legislature, and being supported by the League.

The Council approved and instructed the Recorder to write the members of the House from Clackamas County.

## Reports

Mr. Lent reported concerning improvements made in City office and pump house. Also that engineers from Portland had taken sample of city water for analysis, and would probably submit proposition later in regard to removing offensive taste and odor. Also that nothing had been done in regard to extending water main to Mr. Tuckett's property. Suggested moving toilet downstairs from its present location on second floor of City Hall.

Mr. Larson reported having had 'phone removed from City Hall to his home; also that hose cart was now stationed at pump house, and exhibited and demonstrated a siren, but recommended one more powerful.

He also submitted list of other desired equipment and costs of same.

Matter referred to Fire and Water Committee.

Whereupon Mr. Hornig addressed the Council, asking what action they proposed to take with regard to dirt left in the streets by the irrigation promoters, as well as the dangerous catch basins.

The Recorder was instructed to write Mr. Thomas asking him to meet with the Street Committee within ten days and take up this matter.
