Whereupen the fellowing resolution was introduced by Bates, and en metion, seconded and carried, declared adepted:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS; Heretofore on the 22nd day of March 1920, the Council of the City of Canby, duly passed a resolution declaring it's purpose of making the hereinafter described improvement, which resolution directed publication and posting of notice thereof, and adopted the plans and specifications and estimates of the City Surveyor therefor for the improvement of "B" Street in Canby and intersection of Second Street. And Whereas, said resolution was kept in the office of the City Recorder and published in the Clackamas County News, a Newspaper published and of general circulation in the City of Canby, and by posting three copies thereof in three public and conspicuous places in Canby at least fifteen days before the time set by said resolution as the last day in which a remonstrance against said improvement might be filed, and; Whereas the Council had obtained jurisdiction to order the proposed improvement to be made, there having been no legal remonstrance filed against said improvement, it was duly Ordained as follows:

That "B" Street from the Westerly line of Front Street to the Easterly line of Second Street in said City of Canby be improved by grading, draining, shouldering, and paving same with hard surface payement sixteen feet wide, and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement, such improvement to be made in accordance with the plans and specifications of the City Surveyor, heretofore adopted therefor, which Ordinance was duly approved by the Mayor and there fter went into full force and effect.

That under and by virtue of said Ordinance, and the Charter of the City of Canby, Canby created a City Lien for the paving of "B" Street as heretofore set forth, upon which Street the property hereinafter described abutted, to wit: Lots seven and eight in Block One of the original Townsite of Canby according to the duly recorded plat thereof. And; Whereas, after said improvement was duly made, Charles F. Rauch and M. Effie Nelson, the owners of said Lots seven and eight in Block One, Canby duly made application to the City of Canby to be allowed to pay for said improvement by installments, with interest at six per cent per annum, as payable annually as provided in the Canby City Charter, said interest payments to be made when each installment is paid, And; Whereas said Charles F. Rauch and M. Effie Nelson did thereafter sell and dispose of said Lots seven and eight in Block One Canby, to G. E. Byrnes, and Whereas; said Lots seven and eight Block One Canby, were thereafter sold at Sheriff's sale, by

virtue of a judgment given in the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Clackamas County, against said G. E. Byrnes, and in favor of one G. F. Benson, at which sale G. F. Benson became the purchaser of said Lots, and obtained a Sheriff's deed to said property, and Whereas; neither Charles F. Rauch, M. Effie Nelson, G. E. Byrnes nor G. F. Benson has paid the said City Lien on said property nor any part of said Lien, though often demanded, and Whereas; The said City of Canby has issued and sold a Bond for the amount of said Lien, and for which it is liable, and Whereas said Lien on said Lots seven and eight in Block One Canby is long since due and payable and now is of the amount of \$713.42, Now, Therefore it is RESOLVED by the City Council of Canby, that the City Recorder be, and he hereby is ordered to Advertise and sell said Lots seven and eight in Block One Canby, to satisfy said Lien, And that the City Recorder give due notice of the time and place of said sale, by publishing the same in the Canby Herald for four successive weeks, and by posting notice thereof in three public and conspicuous places in Canby for the same length of time.

Whereupen the matter of designating a certain time for cleaning up the City was brought up, and it meeting the approval of the Council, the Mayor stated that the week from April 13 to the 18th would be considered as " Clean up" week.

There appearing no other business, en metien, seconded and carried, the Council adjourned.
