June 17-1931

A special meeting of the City Council was held on Wednesday, June 17, 1931 at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Dedman, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans, and Councilmen Dimick, Koehler, Meeks, Patch, Porter and Thompson. Absent Bates and Graham.

The Mayor stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of hearing the report of the Electric Light Committee with regard to the testing of the Molalla Electric Co. meter.

Mr. Patch stated that Louis Lent would tell the Council what had been done in regard to this matter.

Mr. Lent stated that he had called on the Public Service Commission, who signified their willingness to send an engineer for the testing, but suggested that we apply to O.A.C. for a man to act in conjunction.

After some discussion it was moved by Patch, seconded by Porter and carried, that the Council employ Mr. L.E. Kurtichanoff to make the test, and that the Recorder notify him and ask the Public Service Commission to fix a date and advise Mr. Kurtichanoff of the same. Also to notify the Molalla Electric Company of this action.

On motion, seconded and carried, the Council adjourned, subject to call by the Mayor.

JULY 6 1931

THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL WAS HELD ON MONDAY, JULY 6 AT THE USUAL HOUR OF 8 O'CLOCK P. M.

ON ROLL CALL THERE WERE PRESENT: MAYOR DEDMAN, ATTORNEY WAIT, CHIEF OF POLICE LENT, RECORDER H. B. EVANS AND COUNCILMEN BATES, DIMICK, KOEHLER, PORTER AND THOMPSON.

COUNCILMAN MEEKS REPORTED LATER AND GRAHAM AND PATCH WERE ABSENT.

Whereupon, Mr. Kurtchanoff, the engineer employed by the City for a test of the meter installed by the Molalla Electric Co., being present and having his report at hand, read the same to the Council. Considerable discussion and questions asked him.

Mr. Kurtchanoff suggested and recommended that test equipment be left connected, and after a new meter was installed, as agreed by the Molalla Electric Co., that another test be taken. Mr. Hanlon of the Public Service Commission, being present, stated that he had been present at the test, and that with a new meter installed and disassociation from the Molalla Electric wires, we should have no further trouble.

Whereupon the City Treasurer read his reports covering the quarter ending June 30, and the same having been audited by the Finance Committee, was accepted and ordered made a part of these minutes. Reports follow:
