Whereupon, on motion of Bates seconded by Patch and carried, it was voted to install a transformer at the Fair Grounds.

The following matters were then presented and disposed of as follows:

Matter of "spotting" the water tank left to Fire and Water Committee.

Street Committee and Superintendent requested to investigate the advisability of cutting grass along the various streets.

Mr. H. E. Browne reported the usual mess in the vicinity of the Stefani lumber yard, and the Street Committee was instructed to look after same.

Fire Chief Larson reported having made a run to fire at New Era.

The City Recorder was instructed to prepare and acceptance to be signed by the Canby Rivers Irrigation Company in the matter of their franchise.

On motion, seconded and carried, it was voted to allow a change in the laying of the pipe line of the above Company, by granting them the privilege of using "E" street, subject to the approval and under the direction of the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

There being no other business on motion, seconded and carried, The Council adjourned.
