Regular Monthly Meeting August 4-1930

The Council met in regular session on Monday, August 4, 1930 at the usual hour.
On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent,
Recorder H.B. Evans, and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Koehler, Patch, Pfister, Thompson,
White and Zimmerman.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Communications.

Letter from Elisha A. Baker, Portland attorney in the interest of the Methodist Church of Canby, and stating that reasonable time would be given for piping or replacing surface in the vicinity of the Church, and correcting unfavorable conditions caused by excavations made by the Canby Rivers Irrigation Co.; also stating that if nothing should be done in the matter, on behalf of his client, necessary steps would be taken to attain the ends for which they were contending.

Whereupon Attorney J.E. Hedges being present at the request of Father Jonas, addressed the Council at some length, reading from the City charter, passages relating to city streets, and stated that the Council had no authority to allow such a menace as was occasioned by the irrigation ditch in process of construction.

Mr. Hornig also informed the Council that if nothing were done in the matter within thirty days, he would take legal action.

Whereupon, Adam Knight being present, addressed the Council and recommended that Fire Chief Larson be allowed to attend the annual convention of fire chiefs at Corvallis, at the expense of the City.

On motion, seconded and carried, it was voted to adopt the above recommendation, and Mr. Larson was so instructed.

Whereupon Mr. Lent recommended that the Council investigate the matter of filing water rights to certain springs on the Molalla River; also matter of applying for cheaper electric power rates and advisability of generating our own power.

Whereupon it was moved, seconded and carried that warning cards be printed to use in cases of violations of traffic rules.

SECTION III.—Rate: First 100 hours use of the active load or demand at the Primary Schedule; all K. W. H. over that specified for the primary schedule applies at the Secondary Schedule.

First 100 K. W. H. at 6c per K. W. H. Next 400 K. W. H. at 5c per K. W. H. Next 500 K. W. H. at 3c per K. W. H. Next 4000 K. W. H. at 3c per K. W. H. All excess K. W. H. at 2c per K. W. H. All excess K. W. H. at 2c per K. W. H. Minimum Charge \$1.00 per month per K. W. of the maximum demand, but no minimum charge to be less than \$1.25. Definition of Demand: Demand is defined as being the greatest average rate at which energy is used within a period of five consecutive minutes, and will be assessed or measured, subject to the minimum as specified in our Ordinance.

Motors: Each horse-power of the manufacturers' rated capacity shall be considered as 750 watts.

SECTION IV.—This Ordinance hereby repeals all former Ordinances passed regulating or affecting the rates of the City of Canby, Oregon, Light and Power System, so far as they conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance.
