

Regular Monthly Meeting
Sept. 2-1930

The Council held its regular monthly meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 2, 1930, at the regular hour, the first Monday being a holiday.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Koehler, Patch, Pfister, Thompson and Zimmerman. Absent, Councilman White.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Whereupon the Recorder read a communication from the Moore Dry Dock Co. of San Francisco offering to sell the City, two Diesel engines at a much reduced price.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above claims were allowed.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported having cut in two new water customers and one light. Also that two transformers had been rented for the Fair Grounds.

Fred Larson submitted a very interesting report of the Fire-Chiefs Convention at Corvallis, and made several recommendations which if adopted would make the Fire-Department of Canby much more efficient.

Some of the matters mentioned were a siren in place of bell on fire truck; small fire extinguisher in place of chemical; gas masks; fire Ordinance and painting of the hydrants and stand-pipes.

In accordance with the last mentioned, the Water Committee was instructed to paint hydrants and stand-pipes and clear away weeds and grass.

Whereupon on motion of Graham seconded by Patch and carried, it was voted to repair the roof of the pump house and improve the adjacent grounds as fast as possible.

Whereupon the Mayor asked the Water Committee to investigate the matter of trading in old unused pump house equipment for new pump.

Sept. 2-continued.

The following Ordinance then came up for final action, and on motion, seconded and carried, placed on final passage. Yeas 7-nays 0.

Whereupon the Mayor announced the Ordinance duly passed.

ORDINANCE No. 1930-4v

An ordinance fixing the rates to be charged the users of Electric Light power and Heat furnished by the Electric Light and Power System of Canby, Oregon, and repealing all ordinances hereto passed, which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I.—The following rates for Light, Power, and Heat shall be paid Canby by the users of the same, to be paid for monthly to-wit:

FOR RESIDENTIAL LIGHTING, HEATING, AND POWER

First 20 K. W. H. \$1.25
Next 30 K. W. H. at 5c per K. W. H.
Next 40 K. W. H. at 3c per K. W. H.
All excess K. W. H. at 2c per K. W. H.

COMMERCIAL LIGHTING AND HEATING

SECTION II.—Rate: First 100 hours use of the active load or demand per month at the primary schedule; all K. W. H. in excess of the first 100 hours use of the demand at the secondary schedule.

First 15 K. W. H. \$1.25
Next 85 K. W. H. at 7c per K. W. H.
Next 100 K. W. H. at 6c per K. W. H.
Next 800 K. W. H. at 5c per K. W. H.
Next 1000 K. W. H. at 4c per K. W. H.
Next 2000 K. W. H. at 3c per K. W. H.
All excess K. W. H. at 2c per K. W. H.

Secondary Schedule:

First 1000 K. W. H. at 3c per K. W. H.
All excess K. W. H. at 2c per K. W. H.
Minimum charge of \$1.00 per month per K. W. of the active load or demand but no minimum charge to be less than \$1.25.

POWER RATE

SECTION III.—Rate: First 100 hours use of the active load or demand at the Primary Schedule; all K. W. H. over that specified for the primary schedule applies at the Secondary Schedule.

Primary Schedule:

First 100 K. W. H. at 6c per K. W. H.
Next 400 K. W. H. at 5c per K. W. H.
Next 500 K. W. H. at 4c per K. W. H.
Next 4000 K. W. H. at 3c per K. W. H.
All excess K. W. H. at 2c per K. W. H.

Secondary Schedule:

First 5000 K. W. H. at 2c per K. W. H.
All excess K. W. H. at .015 per K. W. H.

Minimum Charge \$1.00 per month per K. W. of the maximum demand, but no minimum charge to be less than \$1.25. Definition of Demand: Demand is defined as being the greatest average rate at which energy is used within a period of five consecutive minutes, and will be assessed or measured, subject to the minimum as specified in our Ordinance.

Motors: Each horse-power of the manufacturers' rated capacity shall be considered as 750 watts.

SECTION IV.—This Ordinance hereby repeals all former Ordinances passed regulating or affecting the rates of the City of Canby, Oregon, Light and Power System, so far as they conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance.

Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council on Monday evening August 4, 1930, ordered published, and to come up for final hearing and passage at the regular meeting of the Council on Tuesday evening, September 2, 1930.
