

Special Meeting
Sept. 19, 1930

The Council met in special session on Friday, Sept. 19 at 3 o'clock P.M.

The following were present: Mayor Dedman, Recorder H.B. Evans, and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Keebler, Pfister, White and Zimmerman.

The Mayor announced that the meeting was called for the purpose of listening to the proposition of the Canby Rivers Irrigation Co. with regard to correcting their ditch along certain routes, so that adjacent property owners might be satisfied.

Mr. Thomas, being present, explained the plan of covering the ditch with strong wire netting, for a certain distance, and also of piping instead of leaving ditch open where it was too deep.

After some discussion, the Council decided, before accepting the above proposed change, to have the Street Committee secure the advice of a competent attorney who had had experience in Municipal affairs.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried, it was voted to adjourn the meeting until 8 o'clock P.M. on Thursday, Sept. 25, when Mr. Thomas could again be present.

Special Adjourned Meeting.
Sept. 25-1930

The Council met in adjourned special meeting on Thursday, Sept. 25, 1930 at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Mayor Dedman, Chief of Police Lent and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Patch, Koehler, Pfister and Zimmerman.

In the absence of the Recorder, Mr. Lent kept the minutes.

Mr. Chris Schubel, Attorney, having been retained by the Street Committee, and being present, addressed the Council at some length; stating that the Council had acted within its rights in granting a franchise to the Canby Rivers Irrigation Company.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried unanimously, it was voted to accept the proposition of Mr. Thomas as to changes in the ditch, and as outlined in the meeting of September 19, and he to make a written request within three days for permission from the Council, to continue work.

Whereupon the Council then adjourned.
