The Council met in special session on Monday, March 24 at 8 o'clock, P.M. On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, Atty Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Koehler, Pfister, Thompson, White and Zimmerman. Absent Patch.

The Mayor announced that the purpose of the meeting was to listen to the report of the Committee appointed to investigate the matter of new pump equipment.

The Committee reported that it had investigated the equipment at Woodburn installed by the Byron-Jackson Co., and that it favored and believed that a similar equipment would be satisfactory to Canby.

The Recorder re ad a letter from the above company, in which prices were quoted

and recommendations made as to our needs in the matter. Prices as follows:

Pump \$ 1000.00
Add. stage 20.00
2 motors 135.00

Total \$ 1155.00

Mr. A. H. Marshall, representative of the above Company, being present, addressed the Council and explained various matters in regard to the proposition of his company.

On motion of Graham, seconded by Bates and carried, it was voted to purchase the necessary equipment from the Byron-Jackson Co. at the above figure.

Whereupon the matter of the proposed irrigation ditch was presented, and the Ordinance introduced on March 3 at the regular meeting being read, Mr. Wait offered several suggestions as to changes and additions which he thought should be made, and it was decided to leave the matter in the hands of the Committee on Streets and Public Property to confer with the Irrigation company and our attorney with the idea of drawing new franchise Ordinance to be presented at the next regular meeting.
