The regular monthly meeting of the Council was held on Monday, Octo. 7, 1929

at 8 o'clock P.M. On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Patch, Pfister, Thompson, White and Zimmerman. Absent, Koehler.

The minutes of the previous meeting of Sept. 3 were read and approved.

Whereupon the Recorder read a communication from H. Kronberg relative to improvement of road leading to his property. This was in the form of a resolution, which the Council was asked to approve and act upon, to the effect that certain improvements would be made at the present time or some time in the future. No action taken.

Whereupon a bid on ten thousand water and light receipts by the Canby Herald was read, the offer being to furnish same at a price of \$ 7.65 per thousand.

On motion, seconded and carried, the offer was accepted and the Canby Herald was or-

dered to prepare same at once.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 7, nays 0.

Whereupon the reports of the City Treasurer covering the various funds for the quarter ending Sept. 30 were read, and having been audited by the Finance Committee were approved and ordered made a part of the minutes of this meeting.

Whereupon Chairman Zimmerman of the Street Committee reported the installation of three " Stop" signs at the intersection of "B", "C" and "D" with First Street; also that various streets were in need of improvement. Matter left to Committee and Street Superintendent.

Mr. Patch of the Light Committee stated that there seemed to be need of a light at the Giger corner. Referred to Committee.

Mr. Kronberg addressed the Council, explaining his action in presenting the above mentioned resolution and stating how badly improvements were needed on the road to his property. Referred to Street Committee.

Mr. Smith also addressed the Council, asking for improvements to be made on road leading to the old Burns place on the south side of town. Left to Committee.

Whereupon Mr. Milo Lee addressed the Council, advising and recommending the drilling of an artisian well for City water supply.

Mr. Hornig being called upon by the Mayor told the Council that there should either be new pipe installed in city well or present pipe should be threaded.

The matter of amending the Ordinance governing traffic and regulating vehicles again being presented, after some discussion was laid over until the next meeting.

Whereupon the following Ordinance came up for final action:

ORDINANCE No.(2.)

An ordinance appropriating the sum of Three Hundred Sixteen Doliground fifteen cents (\$316.50) for the purchase of fire hose and nozzle for the use of the Canby Fire Department, and ordering a warrant to be drown in that amount on the general fund for payment to the American Rubber Company, for said material. Canby Does Ordain as Follows:

The sum of Three Hundred Sixteen Dollars and fifty cents is hereby appropriated for the use of the Canby Fire Department, and a warrant is hereby ordered to be drawn on the General Fund for that sum in favor of the American Rubber Company.
