

Regular Monthly Meeting
Febr. 4-1929

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, Febr. 4, 1929 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Bates, Koehler, Patch, Thompson, Weygandt, White and Zimmerman. Mr. Graham reported later.

The minutes of the meeting of January 7 adjourned to January 11th and 17th were read and approved.

The following Ordinance then came up for final action:

ORDINANCE NO. ²³⁷ 1929-33

An Ordinance fixing the rates to be charged for residential light and power and making a rebate on the commercial rates as fixed at present, and amending all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances heretofore passed, wherein the rates differ from the rates set forth hereinafter in this Ordinance so far as they may conflict with this Ordinance, and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- The following rates for light, power and heat shall be paid Canby by the users of the same;

RESIDENTIAL				
First	15	K.W.H.	or less per month	\$ 1.25
Next	5	K.W.H.	Do	.07
Next	20	K.W.H.	Do	.05
Next	50	K.W.H.	Do	.03
Balance				.02

Minimum monthly charge \$ 1.25

COMMERCIAL

SECTION 2- There shall be a rebate allowed of ten percent on the total monthly charge of all users of Commercial lighting, heating and power service, at the rate now in force.

February 4-continued.

SECTION 3-That all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances heretofore passed and conflicting with any of the provisions of this Ordinance, be and hereby are repealed, so far as they conflict herewith.

SECTION 4- Inasmuch as there is urgent need that this Ordinance go into immediate force and effect, in order that suitable and reasonable charges be adopted for the consumers of light and power in Canby, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at an adjourned meeting of the Council held on Thursday, January 17, 1929, and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting to be held on Monday, February 4, 1929.
