

Regular Monthly Meeting
March 4, 1929

The City Council met in regular monthly session on Monday, March 4, 1929 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Keehler, Patch, Thompson, White and Zimmerman.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Whereupon a communication from the Union Oil Company was read, in which they made application to erect a wholesale gasoline storage plant adjacent to the Pacific Highway and on land recently purchased from the Snell Estate. Mr. Schroeder, representing the Company, being present spoke in regard to the matter, explaining to the Council, the nature of the business the Company had in mind.

On motion of Graham seconded by Thompson and carried the above application was granted and permit signed by Mayor Dedman, Fire Chief Wilson Evans and the members of the Fire and Water Committee.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported having laid new water pipe to the Haines and Kendall houses on Third street. Also the extension of light service to H. Kronberg, and installation of transformer and new connections for the Stefani saw-mill.

He also stated that the water pump motor was in need of new bearings, and on motion, seconded and carried was instructed to see that they be supplied and installed.

Mr. Zimmerman of the Street Committee reported that Mr. Rigdon would try out the Diesel engine belonging to the City, for the purpose of finding out if it would answer his needs, and with the idea of purchasing the same if satisfactory.

He also stated that work should be done on Third street, the streets adjacent to the new telephone building and a stretch running from the Pacific Highway to the Lucke stockyards. The Street and Finance Committees were instructed to investigate.

Mr. H. Kronberg, being present, stated that he appreciated the work already done on the road leading to his property and asked that the job be completed. Referred to Street Committee.

March 4-continued.

Whereupon the Mayor statd that the next order of business would be the election of a Councilman to fill the vacancy caused by the change of residence of Mr. Weygandt, who automatically became disqualified by moving from the City.

B.P.Pfister and Otto Krueger were nominated, and on balloting, Mr. Pfister received 4 votes and Mr. Krueger 3.

Whereupon the Mayor announced that Mr. Pfister had been elected to the Council to serve until the next general election.

Whereupon it appearing that the City Fire truck should be equipped with a self starter, it was moved seconded and carrked that it should be installed as soon as possible.

On motion, seconded and carried, the Council then adjourned.

Regular Monthly Meeting
April 1-1929

The Council met in regular session on Monday, April 1, 1929 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Dedman, City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Bates, Graham, Koehler, Patch, Thompson, White and Zimmerman. Absent, Pfister.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Whereupon, a representative from Fairbanks, Morse & Co. being present, with regard to furnishing the City with a new motor, the order of business was suspended and he was asked to address the Council.

An offer was made to furnish a 25 Horse-power motor at a price of \$ 377.00, taking in exchange the present 15 horse-power motor at \$ 100.00, and the Diesel engine belonging to the City at \$ 300.00.

On motion of Koehler, seconded by Graham and carried, the above trade was ordered. (Later, F-M & Co. would not sanction).
