

October 1, 1928

The Council met in regular session on Monday, October 1, 1928 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Dedman, Garrett, Graham, Koehler, Patch, Shewey, White and Zimmerman.

The minutes of the meetings of September 4th., 10th., and 11th. were read and approved.

#### Reports of Committees.

Chairman Zimmerman of the Street Committee reported not having yet put in crosswalks where needed.

Whereupon on motion of Shewey seconded by Garrett and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for the laying of crosswalks at 5th and B streets and adjacent to the old telephone building, details to be supplied by the Committee.

The Finance Committee reporting on the petition for change in light rates, stated that the matter should be given careful attention, but in view of the approaching election, believed no action advisable until after that date.

Chief of Police Lent reported that new bedding should be purchased for the jail.

City Treasurer Eid presented and read his reports for the quarter ending September 30, and they were ordered turned over to the Finance Committee for audit.

Whereupon the following Ordinance came up for final action:

ORDINANCE

An Ordinance providing for the holding of a Special Election for the purpose of submitting to the Legal Voters of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, for their adoption or rejection, the proposition of the Portland Electric Power Company, to purchase from Canby, it's Electric Light and Power System and it's Water System, paying Canby therefore the sum of forty seven thousand eight hundred dollars, so much of said sum as necessary to be used in assuming and liquidating the outstanding Bonds and Warrants unpaid against said Electric Light and Power System and Water System, and the balance to be paid to Canby in cash, and declaring an emergency.

Canby Does Ordain as Follows:

SECTION 1. That there shall be held in Canby, Oregon, on Tuesday, November sixth, 1928, a Special Election for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of Canby, for their adoption or rejection, the proposition of the Portland Electric Power Company, to purchase from Canby it's Electric Light and Power and it's Water System, and to pay to Canby therefor the sum of forty seven thousand eight hundred dollars, so

much of said sum as necessary (about twenty-three thousand five hundred dollars,) to be used in assuming and liquidating the outstanding Bonds and Warrants against said Canby Electric Light and Power System and Water System, and the balance (about twenty-four thousand three hundred dollars) to be paid to Canby in cash.

SECTION 2. The Recorder of Canby, is hereby authorized and directed to post in six public and conspicuous places within the Corporate limits of Canby for at least two consecutive weeks prior to Tuesday November sixth, 1928, Notices of the Special City Election to be held in Canby, on said date, to wit: Tuesday, November Sixth, 1928, which said Notices of Special Election shall state the date upon which said Special Election shall be held, shall designate the purpose of said Special Election, the polling place thereof, the hours that the polls shall be open, and shall name the Judges and Clerks of said Election, and shall give the ballot title of the proposed act to be submitted to a vote of the Electors of Canby, for their adoption or rejection, at said Special City Election.

I, H. B. EVANS, being duly sworn, say, that I duly posted copies of the foregoing Ordinance as correct copies

SECTION 3. The Council of Canby shall hereafter by motion appoint Judges and Clerks of said Special City Election; That said Judges and Clerks shall receive as full compensation for their services included within the Corporate limits of Canby.

SECTION 4. The Election Ward or Precinct, for said Special City Election, shall be and constitute all of the territory included within the Corporate limits of Canby.

SECTION 5. There shall be one Polling Place for said Special City Election, to wit: The Council Chamber of the City Hall.

SECTION 6. Whereas, it is deemed important that this Ordinance become operative at once, therefore to preserve the best interests and peace and health of Canby, and it's citizens, an emergency is hereby declared, and this Ordinance shall immediately become operative and of full force and effect upon it's passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time, at a meeting of the Council held on September 11th, 1928, and ordered posted, for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday October first, 1928.
