City Treasurer Eid presented and read his reports for the quarter ending September 30, and they were ordered turned over to the Finance Committee for audit.

The Recorder of Canby, is hereby authorized and directed to post in six public and conspicuous places within the Corporate limits of Canby for at least two consecutive weeks prior to Tuesday November sixth, 1928, Notices of the Special City Election to be held in Canby, on said date, to wit: Tuesday, November Sixth, 1928, which said Notices of Special Election shall state the date upon which said Special Election shall be held, shall designate the purpose of said Special Election, the polling place thereof, the hours that the polls shall be open, and shall name the Judges and Clerks of said Election, and shall give the ballot title of the proposed act to be submitted to a vote of the Electors of Canby, for their adoption or rejection, at said Special City Election.
