The following Ordinance was then introduced:

ORDINANCE NO. 3

An Ordinance for the purpose of leyying a tax on all taxable property both real and personal within Canby and declaring an emergency.

## CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- The Council of the City of Canby does hereby levy a tax of \$\\\ 4370.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the corporate limits of Canby, which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the sheriff and tax collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1929, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1928.

Said levy shall consist of \$\\$\\$3010.00 known as the regular City tax and \$\\$\\$\\$1360.00 special tax heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.

SECTION 2- Whereas it is necessary that Canby shall raise the sum of money aforesaid, to meet the expenses of the City, and protect the health and safety of the inhabitants thereof, and emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its final passage and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council held on November 5, 1928 and ordered posted for the reason that the cost of publication thereof was excessive, in the opinion of the Council, and to come up for final hearing at a regular meeting of the Council to be held on December 3, 1928.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried, the Council adjourned to meet on Thursday, November 8 at 8 o'clock P.M.
