ORDINANCE NO. (256)

An Ordinance fixing the rates to be charged the users of Electric Light, Power and Heat furnished by the Electric Light and Power System of Canby, Oregon, and repealing all Ordinances heretofore passed which conflict with the provisions of the Ordinance, and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 4- All bills are due and payable the first of each month, and if not so paid by the middle of that month, the service will be turned off until payment is made of the amount due up to the time it is again turned on, together with one dollar additional for the expense of turning service on and off.

SECTION 5- This Ordinance hereby repeals all former Ordinances passed, regulating or affecting the Canby, Oregon Light and Power System, so far as they conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6- Inasmuch as there is urgent need that this Ordinance go into immediate force and effect to relieve Canby from the present oppressive light and power charges, and for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Canby, an emergency is hereby declared and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

SECTION 7- The hereto annexed Schedules, to-wit; Schedule A-5 in regard to residential service; Schedule A-6 in regard to commercial lighting and heating, and Schedule H-2 in regard to Power, are hereby made part and parcel of this Ordinance.

Read for the first time at the regular meeting of the Council held on December 3, 1928, and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on January 7, 1929.

The vote on the above stood as follows: Yeas 5-Nays 2.

The following Ordinance then came up for final action:

ORDINANCE NO. 1908 - 300

An Ordinance for the purpose of leyying a tax on all taxable property both real and personal within Canby and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1-The Council of the City of Canby does hereby levy a tax of \$4370. on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the corporate limits of Canby, which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of oregon, by the sheriff and tax collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1929, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1928.

Said levy shall consist of \$3010.00 known as the regular City

tax and \$ 1360.00 special tax heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.

SECTION2- Whereas it is necessary that Canby shall raise the sum of money aforesaid, to meet the expenses of the City, and protect the health and safety of the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its final passage and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council held on November 5, 1928 and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final hearing at a regular meeting of the Council to be held on Dec. 3, 1928.
