

March 5-1928

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, March 5, 1928 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Dedman, Graham, Koehler Patch, Shewey, White and Zimmerman.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above claims were allowed.

Whereupon a discussion on the sidewalk situation arising, the Mayor asked the Committee on Streets and Public Property to give the matter of defective walks some attention.

Councilman Shewey then bro't up the question of allowing the fire chief some compensation for his services, and also for the person driving the fire truck when called out. In the discussion following it developed that there was considerable work in drying out the hose properly, and in caring for it after fires. It was also suggested that a rack should be constructed for the hose.

Mayor Bair asked the " Fire and Water " Committee to take the above matter in charge, to have a rack built and bring in at the next meeting, recommendations as to remuneration as mentioned above.

Whereupon it was moved, seconded and carried that the deed from the Snell heirs, conveying a certain piece of land adjoining the new Union High School grounds, be accepted and the City Attorney was requested to prepare the necessary Ordinance providing the payment of the sum of One hundred forty five dollars (\$ 145.00) the price agreed upon.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was introduced:

ORDINANCE NO. ⁽²³⁰⁾ 27

An Ordinance providing for the sale by Canby to the Molalla Electric Company, a certain Pole Line hereinafter in this Ordinance specified.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1, Whereas the Molalla Electric Company has offered to purchase from Canby a certain part of Canby's Pole Line consisting of the following described personal property, to-wit:

the above described personal property being located on real property in Canby, County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of L.A. Seeley Donation Land Claim in Section four, Township four South, Range one East of the W.M., thence westerly following the southerly boundary line of the Southern Pacific Company's property 1000 feet, more or less, to a point in the northern side of the Pacific Highway, in Section five, Township four South of Range one East of the W.M., all as shown in Blue Print attached to original Agreement of sale, and has paid to Canby the sum of \$ 62.79 for the above described personal property,

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ORDAINED by the City Council of Canby that Canby does sell, assign, transfer and set over to the said Molalla Electric Company the Pole Line and fixtures as herein above described for the said price of \$ 62.79 .

Read for the first time at this meeting of the City Council held on March 5, 1928 and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on April 2, 1928.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was introduced:

ORDINANCE NO. ⁽²³¹⁾ 28

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. passed by the City Council on May 3, 1926, fixing the charges for water passing through the meters in the City of Canby, by striking out and repealing Section four (4) of said Ordinance, and substituting for said Section four (4) of said Ordinance aforesaid, the following Schedule of charges for water used through meters in Canby, and declaring an emergency.

SECTION 2- That Section four (4) of an Ordinance fixing water rates and passed by the City Council of Canby, Oregon on May 3, 1926 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3- Whereas, this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the people of Canby, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect, from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at this meeting of the City Council held on March 5, 1928 and ordered posted, for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on April 2-1928.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried, the Council adjourned.
