

May 7-1928

The Council met in regular session on Monday, May 7, 1928.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Garrett, Graham, Koehler, Patch, Zimmerman. Councilmen Dedman, Shewey and White reported later.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above claims were allowed.
Yeas 6-Nays 0.

Whereupon, Mr. Elmer Gribble and H.H. Worthington being present, asked for improvement of the road leading to the Knight Bridge, stating that it was badly in need of repairs.

It was admitted that considerable work on the road was needed, and the Mayor asked the Street Committee to ascertain the probable expense of putting it in shape, and recommended that it be done as soon as possible.

Whereupon Street Commission Rothenberg asked for instructions as to the sidewalk in front of the Ritter property, which was badly decayed. He was instructed to tear up same.

Whereupon the Committee on Fire and Water reported having taken up with Pete Hornig the matter of cleaning out wells and replacing cylinders.

On motion, seconded and carried, the Superintendent was instructed to have new cylinders installed and to clean out wells.

The following Ordinance then came up for final action:

ORDINANCE NO. 1928-29

An Ordinance providing for the purchase of a certain fractional tract of land from the heirs of the estate of A.L.Snell, deceased; said land to be used for the laying out and widening of Poplar Street to its full width, from its western intersection with the Pacific Highway, to in front of the Union High School grounds, and appropriating the sum of One hundred and forty five dollars (\$145.00) out of the street and road fund of Canby for the payment of said tract of land.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1-That Canby does hereby improve Poplar Street from its western intersection with the Pacific Highway to in front of the Union High School grounds, by opening and widening said street to its full width, and in order to do so does hereby purchase from the heirs of the estate of A.L. Snell, deceased, the following described fractional tract of land, to-wit:

A tract of land in the Philander Lee Donation Land Claim in Twp. 3-South and 4 South of Range one East of the W.M., in Clackamas County, Oregon more fully described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the Southwest corner of the said Philander Lee D.L.C., running thence North 9.67 feet to a point; thence North 77° 36' East 342.5 feet to a point; thence North 73° 28' East 490 feet to a point on the East line of the property of the Grantors herein; thence South 26° West 35 feet to a point on the South line of the said Lee D.L.C.; thence South 77° 36' West 840 feet tracing the South line of the said Lee D.L.C. to the place of beginning.

SECTION 2-That there is hereby appropriated out of the Street and Road fund of the City of Canby, the sum of One hundred and forty five dollars (\$145.00) for the purchase of said tract of land as aforesaid.

SECTION 3- That the City Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to issue a warrant for the said sum of One hundred and forty five dollars and deliver the same to the said heirs of said A.L. Snell estate, as soon as the City of Canby shall receive from the said heirs a good and sufficient deed to said aforesaid tract of land.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the City Council held on April 2, 1928 and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at a meeting of the Council to be held on May 7, 1928.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above Ordinance was placed on its final passage. Roll call, Yeas 8-Nays 0.

Whereupon the Mayor announced the Ordinance duly passed.
