

May 23-1928

SPECIAL MEETING.

A Special meeting of the City Council was called on Wednesday, May 23, 1928 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there responded, Mayor Bair, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Dedman, Graham, Koehler, Patch, Shewey and Zimmerman. Absent, Garrett and White.

The Mayor announced that the meeting was called for the purpose of discussing the question of oiling the streets and repairing certain roads and sidewalks.

Mayor Bair stated that arrangements could be made with the County to furnish oil and men and teams to do the work, considerably cheaper than it could otherwise be done. \$ 25.00 per day being the price set.

On motion of Graham, seconded by Patch and carried, it was voted to arrange with the County as above.

Whereupon Chairman Zimmerman of the Street Committee reported having examined carefully the road to Knight's Bridge, passing the Elmer Gribble place, and that to repair it properly would cost at least \$ 800.00.


It appearing to be out of the question to spend this amount of money, at the present time, Mayor Bair suggested that the Street Committee fill in with gravel all bad places in the road, and put it in as good shape as possible in this way.

Whereupon the Mayor reported on the matter of Canby's road tax rebate, and stated that Mr. I.D. Taylor had been asked to figure out the sum due the City of Canby, as he had done with other cities in the County.

Whereupon the dangerous condition of various roofs, owing to dry moss attached, coming up, the Committee on Streets and Public Property was requested to notify owners at once, that the above hazard must be eliminated.

There being no other business, the Council then adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING

A Special meeting of the Council was called on Tuesday, May 29, 1928 at 7.30 o'clock, P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Dedman, Graham, Koehler, Shewey, White and Zimmerman. Atty Wait and Councilman Patch reported later, and Councilman Garrett was absent.

The Mayor announced that in order that the next regular meeting might not be too lengthy, he had called this special session for the purpose of taking up various matters.

He stated that in the matter of oiling the streets, that after further investigation it had been found that the cost would be considerably more than at first estimated, and therefore it had seemed best to take the matter out of the hands of the Committee and place it before the Council.

The estimate of Claud H. Roberts, who is regularly employed by the County on such work was the sum of \$ 504.40 for 17740 feet.

After much discussion pro and con, on motion of Koehler, seconded by Shewey and carried, it was voted to dispense with oiling of the streets this year, with the idea of possibly inserting a certain sum in the budget of next year's expenses.

Whereupon Mr. Lent brought up the advisability of placing a new cylinder in the old well as it now stands, and as he had been instructed to do at the last regular meeting, and asked for further instructions.

Mr. Hornig being present, recommended going down in the well, with about 25 or 30 feet more pipe to the next vein of water, before installing the new cylinder.

On motion of Graham seconded by White and carried, it was voted to adopt the above suggestion, and employ Mr. Hornig to do the work.

On motion, seconded and carried the Council then adjourned.
