

November 7-1927

The Council sat in regular session on Monday, November 7, 1927 at 8 O'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Dedman, Garrett, Koehler, Shewey, White and Zimmerman. Councilmen Graham and Patch were absent.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The Mayor announced that if there were no objections, miscellaneous matters would be considered first, and Mr. Hayes operating the Molalla River Auto Park being present asked permission of the Council to replace the above name with that of the Canby Auto Camp.

On motion, seconded and carried, his request was granted.

On motion, seconded and carried, the Recorder was instructed to give permit to L.H. Wood to build a warehouse off S.P. right of way adjoining "C" Street, the same to conform with insurance requirements.

The matter of renting the City Hall for shows being presented, on motion, seconded and carried it was voted not to rent the Hall for moving pictures, unless the public school or other local affairs were involved.

A communication from the Portland Electric Power Company announcing their acceptance of the franchise recently granted by the City was then read and the Recorder was instructed to advise the Company of the receipt of same.

The following resolution was then introduced by Mr. Shewey and on motion, seconded and carried, declared adopted:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, The Molalla Electric Company has this 7th day of November, 1927, submitted to the City Council of Canby, Oregon, an Agreement setting forth the terms, rates and conditions upon which the said Molalla Electric Company agrees to furnish electric power to Canby, and the said Agreement after due consideration by said City Council, appearing to be fair and equitable; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Canby, therefore that the said City of Canby does hereby enter into said Agreement with the said Molalla Electric Company, and the Mayor and City Recorder of Canby are hereby authorized and directed to sign and enter into said Agreement on behalf of the City of Canby.

Follows the above mentioned Agreement duly signed by the Mayor and City Recorder and with the seal of Canby affixed.

Reports

The Committee on Streets and Public Property reported having completed the laying of gravel on the road to the new Union High School grounds, as well as on the Goods Bridge road.

The Finance Committee announced having verified the report of the City Treasurer for quarter ending September 30, and same was ordered spread on these minutes. Reports follow.

Whereupon the following Ordinance came up for final action:

ORDINANCE NO. ⁽²²⁷⁾ 777-24

An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax on all taxable property both real and personal, within Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- The Council of the City of Canby, Oregon does hereby levy a tax of \$ 7580.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes within the corporate limits of Canby, and which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Sheriff and Tax Collector of Clackamas County, Oregon, during the year 1928, with taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1927.

SECTION 2- Said levy shall consist of \$ 2800.00 known as the regular City tax; \$ 770.00 known as Bond Fund #1 ; \$ 650.00 known as Bond Fund #2, and \$ 3300.00 special tax for the purchase price of the Nelson tract for High School purposes, said special tax having heretofore been approved and voted by the legal voters of Canby at a special election held for that purpose.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the City Council held on Octo. 3, 1927 and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on November 7, 1927.

On motion, seconded and carried, the above Ordinance was placed on its final passage. Roll call. Yeas 6-Nos 0.

Whereupon the Mayor announced the Ordinance duly passed.

Whereupon the following Ordinance⁽²²⁸⁾ was introduced:

ORDINANCE NO. 26

An Ordinance ratifying an agreement heretofore made with the Southern Pacific Railway Company and in accordance with a Resolution passed by the City Council of Canby at its regular meeting on October 3, 1927, and vacating and restoring to the Southern Pacific Railway Company, that certain real property lying in the City of Canby and hereinafter in this Ordinance fully described.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- By virtue of and in accordance with, a Resolution passed, and an agreement entered into with the Southern Pacific Railway Company by the City Council of Canby on October 3, 1927, Canby does hereby vacate and return to the possession of the Southern Pacific Railway Company, the following described real property lying in the Corporate limits of Canby, and being the property of said Southern Pacific Railway Company, to-wit:

That certain piece or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in Sections 32 and 33, Township 3 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, and Section 5, Township 4 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at Engineer's Station 1260-11.7 of the center line of main track of Southern Pacific Company (formerly owned by the Oregon and California Railroad Company) as it is now laid out, owned and operated over and across Sections 32 and 33, Township 3 South, Range 1 East, Willamette Base and Meridian and Sections 4 and 5 Township 4 South, Range 1 East, Willamette Base and Meridian, County of Clackamas, State of Oregon; thence in a northwesterly direction along the westerly line of "G" street in the City of Canby, produced southerly a distance of 80 feet, to the actual point of beginning; thence in a southwesterly direction parallel to and distant 80 feet northwesterly at right angles from the center line of said main track, a distance of 2270 feet, more or less, to a point in the westerly right of way line of the Canby Gravel Pit property of Southern Pacific Company; thence in a northerly direction along said westerly right of way line of said Canby Gravel Pit property a distance of 66 feet, more or less, to a point; thence in a northeasterly direction parallel to and distant 140 feet northwesterly at right angles from the said center line, a distance of 2238 feet, more or less, to a point in the westerly line of "G" street; thence in a southeasterly direction along the west line of said "G" street, a distance of 60 feet to the actual point of beginning, and containing 3.1 acres more or less, and being the real property described in an indenture between said Southern Pacific Railway Company and the City of Canby, dated January 26, 1913.

On motion, seconded and carried, said reading was considered the first reading of the above Ordinance, the same being ordered posted, for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on December 5, 1927.

Whereupon the Mayor requested the Committee on Streets and Public Property to notify all property owners of any defective walks, and to see that repairs were made where necessary.

Mayor Bair also suggested that a toilet and drinking fountain be installed in the City Hall, and the Committee was asked to get estimates on the cost of same.

Councilman Koehler asked for a street light at the Cantwell corner and this matter was left to the Committee on Streets and Public Property.


