

Regular Monthly Meeting
January 3-1927

The City Council met in regular monthly session at 8 o'clock P.M.
Monday, January 3-1927.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, Atty Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H. B. Evans and Councilmen Bowlsby, Dedman, Garrett, Graham Patch, Shewey, White and Zimmerman.

Election of Officers.

Whereupon the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported the cleaning out of the water tank which was found very dirty.

Also that the new transformer to be installed near the W. H. Thompson place had not yet been placed, but would be shortly.

Also that he had bo't twenty five new electric light poles at a cost of 14c per foot delivered.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property reported that arrangements had been made to buy the Chas. Moore place for \$ 700.00 and a piece of land from the Wait property for \$ 100.00; the former for the purpose of opening up Weed Street to the High School property, and the latter for the purpose of correcting the curve where "B" street enters the Guntz Road.

The City Treasurer's report for the fourth quarter and also his annual report was read and ordered turned over to the Finance Committee for audit.

Mayor Bair reported that in conjunction with the Street Committee he had inspected the roads leading to the Kronberg property, and did not believe the City should spend the money for improvement, but suggested that a petition might be circulated asking the City and County to work jointly in the matter; also that interested property owners should contribute.

Whereupon Mr. H. E. Browne being present with a complaint regarding the lack of power in the electric light service, there arose considerable discussion in respect to the matter, and on motion of Graham, seconded by Patch and carried, the Light Committee was instructed to obtain from the Public Service Commission, if possible, a voltmeter and have it installed for a period, in order to find out just what voltage we are receiving from the Robinson lines.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was read:

ORDINANCE

An Ordinance authorizing the purchase of a piece of real property located on Weed street, Canby, Oregon, for the purpose of opening the said Weed street to it's full width, so as to make it available to use as a street to the property of the Union High School at Canby, Oregon.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- Whereas the City Council of Canby, Oregon believes it to be essential and necessary to lay out and open a street leading to the property of the Union High School at Canby, and whereas Weed street is believed to be the proper and most available street for that purpose, and whereas the real property of Charles and Chrisiina Moore now obstructs said Weed street making it unsuitable for that purpose,

SECTION 2- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED , that in order that said Weed street may be unobstructed and suitable for use as a street leading to said Union High School property, that Canby proposes to, and hereby does purchase from Charles and Hristina Moore that certain real property now obstructing said Weed street and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the south boundary line of the Philander Lee and wife Donation Land Claim #49 in Township four (4), South Range one (1), East of the Willamette Meridian, bearing North 78° 15' East and distant 15.03 chains from the Southwest corner of said Lee D.L.C., said beginning point being the Southeast corner of a tract of land deeded by Claude Ety and wife to Edward A. Krueger and which deed is recorded in Book 105, page 388, deed records of Clackamas County, Oregon, and running thence North 78° 15' East along the south boundary of the said Lee Donation Land Claim, 1.23 chains to the land of Anna Schmitt; thence North 26° West along the west line of Anna Schmitt's land 3.66 chains to the South boundary line of Weed's Addition to Canby, Oregon; thence south 64° west, along the said south boundary line of Weed's Addition to Canby, Oregon, 1.17 chains to the land of Arther Knight; thence south 26° east along the East line of the said Arther Knight's land 3.34 chains to the place of beginning, containing forty one hundredths of an acre of land more or less.

SECTION 3- It is proposed to pay Charles and Christina Moore the sum of Seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) for the said above described real property so to be used.

SECTION 4- Whereas this Ordinance is necessary for the public peace, safety and welfare of the people of Canby, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect from and after it's passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the City Council held on January 3-1927 , and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on February 7-1927.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was read:

ORDINANCE NO 21st
(11)

An Ordinance authorizing the purchase of a strip of land at the North end of "B" street in Canby, Oregon, where said "B" street intersects the County Road running from Canby north to the Willamette River, for the purpose of eliminating the sharp turn where "B" street intersects said County Road.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- Whereas the Council of Canby believes it to be essential and necessary to straighten the dangerous turn where the north terminus of "B" street intersects the County Road running north from Canby to the Willamette River, by purchasing a strip of land on the East side of "B" street, where "B" street intersects said County Road, so that the intersection may be made on a light curve instead of at right angles,

SECTION 2- Canby proposes to and hereby does purchase of Wilhelmina Wait the necessary amount of land for that purpose, said land being described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the east side of the County Road that intersects the north end of "B" street in Canby, Oregon, where said County Road turns to the West to connect with "B" street, and being three hundred thirty five (335) feet from the southwest corner of the Wilhelmina Wait property in Canby, Oregon, running thence in a southerly direction one hundred ninety five (195) feet to where it intersects the east line of "B" street; thence in a northwesterly direction following the East line of "B" street eighty one (81) feet; thence in a northerly direction seventy five (75) feet to where it strikes the West side of said County Road; thence East eighty (80) feet to place of beginning, being a wedge shaped piece of land to be used in straightening the intersection of "B" street and said County Road running north to the Willamette River.

SECTION 3- It is proposed to pay one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the said land so to be used.

SECTION 4- Whereas this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the people of Canby, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect from and after it's passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the City Council held on January 3-1927, and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on February 7-1927.

Whereupon on motion, seconded and carried the Council adjourned.
