A special meeting of the City Council was called by the Mayor at 8 o'clock P. M. on Monday-Jan. 17-1927

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans and Councilmen Bowlsby, Dedman, Graham, Patch, Shewey, White and Zimmerman, Absent, Garrett.

Mayor Bair announced that the meeting was called for the purpose of discussing the laying out of streets and roads leading into the new Union High School site.

The following petition was then presented and read by the Recorder:

To the Hon. City Council, City of Canby-Clackamas Co. Oregon.

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to the development of the tract of land owned by the Union High School District, and preparatory to the erection of the proposed new Union High School buildings thereon, the Board of Directors deem it of importance to the best interests of all, both now and especially the future, that certain streets, within the city limits of the City of Canby and passing through the school property, be dedicated to the purpose of being public thoroughfares.

The Board of Directors of Union High School District No. 1, of Clackamas County, Oregon, therefore proposes to deed to the City of Canby, for highway purposes only, a strip of land off from the East edge of the High School property; this strip to be eighty (80) feet wide and extending the full length of the property from North to South along the East boundary line.

Believing it to be to the best interests of the public we therefore respectfully petition your Honorable body to accept the proposed right-of-way and dedicate the same to the purpose of that of a public street in the City of Canby. And further, if consistant with your practice, that the ladies of the Civic Club be asked to select a suitable name for the same.

As the matter is urgent, we respectfully request that your Honorak le body make all such speed consistant with discretion in acting on this matter.
