

## Special Meeting March 21-1927

A Special meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, March 21, 1927. On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H. B. Evans, and Councilmen Garret, Graham, Patch, Shewey and White. Absent Bowlsby, Dedman and Zimmerman.

The Mayor announce that the meeting was called for the purpose of canvassing the votes of the recent City Election.

Whereupon the Recorder read the following results:

To the Hon. Mayor and City Council of Canby.  
Gentlemen:

At a Special City Election held in Canby, in the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, on the 19th day of March, 1927, on the following question:

" Shall Canby raise by taxation, the sum of Three thousand three hundred dollars to purchase three and one half acres of land adjoining the property of Union High School District No. 1, Clackamas County, Oregon, and deed same to said Union High School District for school purposes."

## Regular Meeting- April 4-1927

## Communications.

A letter from the Public Service Commission was read in which it was stated that the complaint of the City of Canby vs. the Molalla Electric Co. had been received and placed on file.

A communication from the Portland Electric Power Company was then read, in which they expressed the wish to open negotiations for the purchase of the City Lighting Plant, as well as the water system.

On motion of Shewey seconded by Patch and carried, the Recorder was instructed to answer the letter and ask that the Company send representatives to meet with the Council at an early date, Monday, April 18th preferred.

### Reports

The report of the City Treasurer for the quarter ending March 31 was read and ordered turned over to the Finance Committee for audit.

Chairman Zimmerman of the Street Committee reported work well underway on road from the Zollner corner to city limits, and on motion, seconded and carried it was voted that the work of the Committee be approved.

The suggestion of Councilman Patch that a stop or warning sign be placed at A and Front streets was left to the Street Committee.

Whereupon the following Resolution was introduced, seconded and carried and declared adopted:

A Resolution providing for the laying out, opening and improving of "B" Street, through a certain tract of land purchased by the City of Canby from Wilhelmina Wait.

WHEREAS, Heretofore the City of Canby purchased from Wilhelmina Wait a certain tract of land lying between the North terminus of "B" street and the County Road that runs from Canby to the Willamette River, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Canby deems it necessary and expedient to straighten out the dangerous angular turn, where at present "B" street connects with said County Road, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF CANBY, that it is hereby declared to be it's intention and purpose to open, locate and improve "B" street to the width of eighty feet through said tract of land as aforesaid.

Whereupon the following Resolution was introduced, seconded, carried and declared adopted:

A Resolution providing for the laying out, opening and improving Weed street through a certain tract of land purchased by the City of Canby from Chas E. Moore and wife.

WHEREAS, Heretofore the City of Canby purchased from Chas. E. Moore and wife a certain tract of land lying at the present South end of Weed street in Canby, Oregon, and

WHEREAS, The City Council of Canby deems it necessary and expedient to extend Weed street through and over the aforesaid tract of land, now therefore BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF CANBY; That it is hereby declared to be it's intention and purpose to open, locate and improve Weed street through and over said tract of land.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was introduced:

ORDINANCE NO. 105

An Ordinance providing for the opening and improving of "B" street in Canby, Oregon, where the North end of "B" street intersects the County Road running north from Canby to the Willamette River and declaring an emergency.

### CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- That "B" street in Canby be laid out, opened and improved through that certain tract of land purchased by the City of Canby from Wilhelmina Wait for that purpose and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the East side of the County Road that intersects the North end of "B" street in Canby, Oregon, where said County Road turns to the West to connect with the present North end of "B" street and being 335 feet north from the southwest corner of the Wilhelmina Wait property in Canby, Oregon; running thence in a southerly direction 195 feet to where it intersects the east line of "B" street; thence in a northwesterly direction following the east line of "B" street 81 feet; thence in a northerly direction 75 feet to where it strikes the west line of said County Road; thence 80 feet to place of beginning, being a wedge shaped piece of land, thereby eliminating the present dangerous turn where "B" street and said County Road intersect, and making "B" street thus laid out and opened, 80 feet wide.



SECTION 2- Whereas there is urgent need for the laying out, opening and improving of "B" street in the manner aforesaid, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect, upon it's passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the Council held on April 4, 1927, and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, May 2, 1927.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was introduced:

ORDINANCE NO. (219) 16

An Ordinance providing for the laying out, opening and improving of Weed street in Canby, Oregon and declaring an emergency.

Whereas, Heretofore the Council of Canby, duly passed a Resolution declaring it's intention and purpose of making the herein-after described Street Improvement:

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS, to wit:

Section I. That Weed Street Canby, be laid out, opened, and improved over and through the tract of land purchased by the City of Canby from Chas. E. Moore and wife, for that purpose, as follows, to wit: Beginning on the West side of Weed Street, at the Northwest corner of the property that was purchased by the City of Canby from Chas. E. Moore and wife, running thence East fifty feet to the East line of Weed Street; Thence South along the East line of Weed Street to the Southeast corner of said property purchased from Chas. E. Moore and wife; Thence West along the South line of said property fifty feet to the Southwest corner of said property on the West line of Weed Street; Thence North along the West line of said property to the place of beginning.

Section II. Inasmuch as there is urgent need of the laying-out, opening, and improving of said Weed Street at an early date, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect, upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the Council held on April 4, 1927, and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, May 2, 1927.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was introduced:

ORDINANCE NO. (220) 17

An Ordinance amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. dated June 14, 1926 entitled, AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT COMPULSORY FOR EVERY PERSON WHO USES OR WISHES TO USE WATER FURNISHED BY THE WATER DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF CANBY, OREGON, TO APPLY FOR AND PROCURE A WATER METER FROM THE CITY AND HAVE IT INSTALLED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF THE WATER DEPARTMENT OF CANBY.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. That Section number two (2) of Ordinance No. passed by the City Council on June 14, 1926 (first reading) final passage on July 6, 1926, be amended by adding the words, "PROVIDED THAT CANBY PAY TO THE OWNER THERE-OF NO GREATER REBATE THAN THE SUM OF \$16.00."

Section II. Whereas there is urgent need for this amendment to the above named Ordinance, and emergency is hereby declared, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect, upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the City Council held on Monday, April 4, 1927 and ordered posted, for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive, and to come up for final action at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on Monday, May 2, 1927.
