The City Council met in regular session on Tuesday, July 6-1926 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, Atty. Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans, Councilmen Bowlsby, Dedman, Patch, Shewey, Swanby and White. Absent, Graham and Wang.

The records of the previous regular meeting of June 7, and those of the special meeting of June 14 were read and approved.

A communication from Foster and Kleiser asking permission to erect a bill board on the Wilson Evans property was read, and permission was granted after listening to their representative who was present.

The following claims against the City were then presented:

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 6 Nos none.

A claim of the Beall Pipe and Tank Corporation for \$ 42.75 was also presented but not allowed and ordered sent to John Koehler.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported that meters were being installed as rapidly as possible.

The Committee on Streets and Publid Property reported that stop signs

were ordered and would be installed in a few days.

The Mayor instructed the above committee to continue to function in the matter of removing moss from buildings, as well as other fire hazards. The City Treasurer's report for quarter ending June 30 was read and referred to Finance Committee.

Mr. Wait reported in the matter of the proposed closing of the old Canby-Barlow road through the gravel pit by the Southern Pacific Co., that he had written the Company asking them to send out a representative but had heard nothing from them.

Mayor Bair suggested that when their representative came, we should be prepared to know just what we wanted in the matter.

Whereupon, Mr. G. F. Morley being present, he was asked to say something concerning the Fire Department of the City.

Mr. Morley suggested various additions to the equipment, such as smoke

masks, rubber coats, axes, ladders, a drying rack for the hose, etc.
He also stated that approaches to some of the hydrants were in very bad condition and should be improved.

Whereupon Mayor Bair suggested that the Committee on Fire and Water call meetings of any and all interested in this matter, for the purpose of getting more thoroughly organized in order to handle fires more efficiently.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was read:

ORDINANCE NO.

An Ordinance making it compulsory for every person who uses or wishes to use water furnished by the Water Department of the City of Canby, Oregon, to apply for and procure a water meter from the City and have it installed by the Superintendent of the Water Department of Canby.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- Every person who is using or who hereafter desires to use water from the Water Department of Canby, Oregon, shall within ten days from the final passage of this Ordinance, and it's approval by the Mayor, make application to the Superintendent of the Water Department of Canby, to have a meter installed on his water pipes, and at the time of the application for a meter shall pay to the said Superintendent of the Water Department, the cost price of said meter and the cost of installing of same.

SECTION 2- The price paid for said meters, and the cost for install-ling the same, paid to the City by the applicant thereof, shall be repaid to to said applicant by the City remitting fifty per cent of the water bill of said applicant each month for two years, unless full re-payment shall have been made for said meters before that time, as provided by

Ordinance of Canby heretofore enacted.

SECTION 3- Any person using water from the Water Department of Canby, without or before making such application for a meter and paying for the same, as in this Ordinance provided, shall have the water turned off from his or her premises, and it shall not again be turned on, until the provisions of the Ordinance are complied with, and the established fee for turning on the water, paid.

WHEREAS? This Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the water and the public peace, health and safety of the people of Canby, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect, from and after it's passage by the Council and it's approval by the Mayor.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that said Ordinance be placed on it's final passage. On roll call, Yeas 6-Nos O. Whereupon the Mayor announced the Ordinance duly passed.
