Whereupon the Recorder was instructed to write the State Highway Commission for permission to run a line from Weed Street along the south side of the Pacific Highway, crossing Highway to Standard Oil plant, for purpose of supplying said plant with electric power.

Report of the City Treasurer for quarter ending Sept. 30 was read and referred to Finance Committee.

Monday, October 11-1926

The City Council met in adjourned session on Monday, Oct. 11 at 8 o'clock P.M.

Roll Call

Present:

Mayor Bair, Atty Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans, and Councilmen Bowlsby, Dedman, Graham, Patch, Shewey, Wang and White. Councilman Swanby reported later.

The Mayor announce that the meeting was called for the purpose of meeting with the Budget Committee, and to listen to any objections to the budget as prepared; also for the purpose of introducing the necessary Ordinance with respect to the tax levy.

On motion, seconded and carried, the report of the Budget Committee was declared adopted by the joint votes of the Council and the Budget Committee.

On motion, seconded and carried, the Council declared for the adoption of the report.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was introduced:

(212)
An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within Canby and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1- The Council of the City of Canby does hereby levy a tax of \$ 5040.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the corporate limits of Canby, which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Sheriff and Tax Collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1927, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes for 1926. Such levy shall consist of \$ 3560.00 known as the regular City tax and \$ 1480.00 special taxes heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.

SECTION 2- WHEREAS? IT is necessary that Canby shall raise the sum of money aforesaid, to meet the expenses of the City and protect the health and safety of the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon it's final passage and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the City Council held on Octo. 11-1926, adjourned from Octo. 4, and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive and to come up for final hearing at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on November 1-1926.

Whereupon the Committee was instructed to secure cost figures for the right of way of road proposed into the new High School site.

It being necessary for the Council to appoint Judges and Clerks for the coming election, on motion, seconded and carried, Mrs. E. Bowlsby and Mrs. Chas. Combs were appointed clerks, and Mrs. Shewey, Mrs. Lent and Mrs. Carl Lucke, judges.

On motion of Graham, seconded by Wang and carried, it was voted to burn the Electric Light bonds, #1 to #20 inc. and which have been retired.
