Regular Meeting-Nov. 1-1926

The City Council met in regular session on Monday, Nov. 1-1926 at 8 o'clock P.M.

On roll call there were present: Mayor Bair, City Attorney Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B. Evans, and Councilmen Bowlsby, Dedman, Graham, Shewey, Swanby, White. Absent Patch and Wang.

The minutes of the meeting of the 4th. of October, and the adjourned meeting on October 11, were read and approved.

On motion, seconded and carried the above claims were allowed. Yeas 6-Nays O.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported that 204 water meters had been installed, and 15 more were to come. He also stated that water revenue for October was about \$\\$100 under that of October last year.

Committee on Streets and Public Property reported progress in interviewing property owners affected by the proposed new street leading to school house site.

On motion of Shewey, seconded by Dedman and carried, the City Attorney was instructed to draw up a resolution of intention with respect to the new street, and present it to the Council at the next meeting, for their consideration.

The Mayor reported that the Cemetery road, the river road and the street adjacent to Bair's warehouse were all in need of attention, and suggested that the Street Committee and the Superintendent of Streets get busy.

Whereupon the following Ordinance came up for final action:

ORDINANCE NO. 1926-9

An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within Canby and declaring an emergency.

no.212

SECTION 1-The Council of the City of Canby does hereby levy a tax of \$ 5040.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the corporate limits of Canby, which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Sheriff and Tax Collector of Clackamas County during the year 1927, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes for 1926. Such levy shall consist of \$ 3560.00 known as the regular City tax, and \$ 1480.00 special taxes heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.

SECTION 2- WHEREAS, It is necessary that Canby shall raise the sum of money aforesaid, to meet the expenses of the City and protect the health and safety of the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon it's final passage and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a meeting of the City Council held on Octo. 11-1926 adjourned from Octo. 4, and ordered posted for the reason that, in the opinion of the Council, the cost of publication thereof is excessive and to come up for final hearing at the regular meeting of the Council to be held on November 1-1926.

On motion, seconded and carried, said Ordinance was placed on final passage. Roll call Yeas 6 Nays O. Whereupon the Mayor announced the Ordinance duly passed.
