

Special Meeting, City Council
November 23-1926

The City Council met in special session on Tuesday, November 23-1926.

Present: Mayor Bair, City Atty Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans and Councilmen Bowlsby-Dedman-Graham-Patch-Shewey-Wang and White. Absent Swanby.

The Mayor announced that the meeting was called for the purpose of hearing remonstrances against the proposed route of street leading into the new school site.

A remonstrance signed by Berlie and M. Francis Nelson was read and considered and ordered placed on file.

The Committee on Streets and Public Property was requested by the Mayor to secure, from the engineer who laid out the above mentioned route, the exact number of feet in each property affected by the proposed street.

There being no other business, on motion, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned.

Dec. 6-continued.

Reports.

Mr. Lent reported the need of another transformer near the W.H. Thompson place, and on motion, seconded and carried it was ordered purchased and installed.

Mr. Lent also reported that he had an opportunity of buying a number of poles at a good figure, and that the City had none on hand. Mayor Bair recommended purchasing them and it was so ordered.

Whereupon Mr. Lent stated that C. A. Dunn had applied for water for irrigation purposes on the Knight place, and that at times he would need 1700 cubic feet per day. The Recorder was instructed to write Mr. Dunn to the effect that it would not be possible to grant his request.

Councilman Bowlsby reported card playing in pool hall contray to Ordinance, and the Chief of Police was instructed to look after the matter.

Mayor Bair reported that some of the teachers had suggested that the curfew ordinance be enforced, and the Chief of Police was asked to give this some attention, as well as other ordinances relating to stray dogs, fast driving, etc.

On motion of Councilman Patch, seconded by Councilman Shewey and carried it was voted that the Committee on Streets and Public Property be authorized to purchase the Chas. Moore property for \$ 700.00; also a corner of the Chas. N. Wait place for \$ 100.00; Ordinances covering these two purchases to be introduced at the next meeting.

Whereupon, Mr. Kronberg being present, the Council was asked if anything had been done or could be done in the way of improving the roads leading to his property. The matter was left to the Street Committee who agreed to make a personal investigation and report.

The question of meters for water in the Masonic and Oddfellows buildings was then brought up, and after some discussion, on motion of Wang seconded by Patch and carried, it was agreed that one meter only should be installed on second floor of each lodge building, and that the lodges make their own arrangements with tenants for payment of water.
