Whereupon Mr. Lent reported two very bad fire hazards, and the Committee on Fire and Water was instructed by the Mayor to look after the matter, and also remove or have removed moss on various buildings where it seemed advisable.

Mayor Bair also recommended that those constituting the volunteer Fire Department, get together occasionally for practice.

Meters.

The matter of deciding on the kind of meters to be bought in accordance with the recent Ordinance passed being next in order, the several meter salesmen present were invited to "show their stuff."

After the various demonstrations, on motion of Councilman Graham, seconded by White and carried, it was voted that the bid of the Hershey Company be accepted, and that seventy five straight reading meters be ordered at once at a price of \$ 11.82 each.

Whereupon Councilman Dedman suggested and advised that at A and E street intersection with the Pacific Highway, stop signs should be placed, and this matter was left to the Committee on Streets and Public Property with power to act.

Special Meeting, June 14-1926

A special meeting of the City Council was held on Monday, June 14-1926 at 7.30 P.M.

On roll call there were present, Mayor Bair, City Atty Wait, Chief of Police Lent, Recorder H.B.Evans, and Councilmen Bowlsby, Dedman, Patch, Shewey, Swanby, Wang and White. Absent Graham.

The Mayor announced that the meeting was called for the purpose of introducing an Ordinance making it compulsory for all users of City water to install meters.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was read:

ORDINANCE NO 8 (211)

An Ordinance making it compulsory for every person who uses or wishes to use water furnished by the Water Department of the City of Canby, Oregon, to apply for and procure a water meter from the City and have it installed by the Superintendent of the Water Department of Canby.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1-Every person who is using or who hereafter desires to use water from the Water Department of Canby, Oregon, shall within ten days from the final passage of this Ordinance, and it's approval by the Mayor, make application to the Superintendent of the Water Department of Canby, to have a meter installed on his water pipes, and at the time of the application for a meter shall pay to the said Superintendent of the Water Department, the cost price of said meter and the cost of installment of same.
