appeared before the Council and explained how he could serve
his Canby surburban customers by running a fourth wire over
the City of Canby's poles thereby the Molalla Electric's
current consumed would not go through the City of Canby's
meter.

it was moved and seconded that Whereupon the Light Supt. be authorized to remove the transformer by the Canby Manufacturing Co.'s building with the understanding that should the Canby Manufacturing Co. need a transformer a new one could be purchased in its place. Whereupon the following ordinance was read:

An ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within Canby and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

section 1. The Council of the City of Canby does hereby levy a tax of \$4,900.00 on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the corporate limits of Canby, which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Sheriff and Tax Collector of Clackamas County, during the year of 1926, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes for 1925. Said levy shall consist of \$3,360.00 known as the regular City tax and \$1,540.00 special taxes heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.

Section 2. Whereas, it is necessary that Canby shall raise

the sum of money aforesaid to meet the expenses of the City and protect the health and safty of the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its final passage and approved by the Mayor.

Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council held on October 5th 1925, and ordered posted for the reason that the cost of publication is excessive in the opinion of the Council, and to come up for hearing of the Council to be held November 2nd 1925.

whereupon it was moved and seconded that the Tax ordinance be placed on its final passage. Upon roll call Ayes 5. Nos D.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that the Council adjourn.
