

## REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY

OREGON, Held March 22nd, 1925.

Meeting called to order by the Mayor, W.H. Bair at 8:00 P.M.

Upon roll call their were present Mayor W.H.Bair, City Attorney C.N.Wait, Recorder C.L.Eid, Chief of Police Louis Lent, Councilmens Bowlsby, Evans, Patch, Shewey, Swanby, Wang and White.

Absent Councilman Dedman.

Whereupon the minutes of the last regular meeting was read and approved as read.

Whereupon the petition of W.R.Self for a permit to construct a building on "A" Street between 1st and 2nd Streets was read. It was moved and seconded that the petition be granted. Motion Carried.

Whereupon ~~it was moved and seconded that~~ the petition asking for the appointment of W.S.Maple for Nightwatchman was read.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that the petition be accepted, to fill the vacancy of Nightwatchman Aug.Rothenberg resigned. Motion Carried.

Whereupon the Mayor duly appointed W.S. Maple Nightwatchman.

A Committee from the Canby Civic Club being present, the Chairman of said Club addressed the Honorable Mayor and City Council and urged the renovating of the City Hall, both inside and out, and also the purchasing of a new heating stove for the Council Chamber.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that the Committee on Streets and Public Property be allowed to expend not to exceed \$125.00 for the renovating of the City Hall and for the purchase of a new heating Stove. Motion Carried.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that all bills read be allowed. Upon roll call Ayes 7, Nos. 0.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was read:

## ORDINANCE NO. 199 (1925-1)

An Ordinance providing for the use and regulation of vehicles on the streets, roads and highways of Canby, providing for the punishment of violation of this act, and prohibiting the unauthorized use of said vehicles.

Canby does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Definition of terms; The term street as used in this act shall mean every public way, thoroughfare and place, including bridges, streets, alleys, and roads, within Canby used or intended for the use of the general public for vehicles.

The term vehicle shall mean every mechanical device moving by other power than human power, over the Streets as herein defined.

Section 2. No vehicle shall be parked or left to stand on First Street of Canby, unless the two right hand wheels of all cars parked on the North side of First Street are within one foot of and parallel with the curb, and all four wheels are off the pavement and parallel with it, of all cars parked on the south side of First Street. And it is furthermore provided that no vehicle shall park or discharge passengers so that any part of said vehicle projects into any cross street, when so parked or discharging passengers.

Section 3. No vehicle shall be parked or left to stand within fifteen feet of any fire hydrant in Canby.

Section 4. No vehicle shall turn on A, B, C, D, or E streets of Canby between First and Second streets. Nor turn on First Street except at intersections.

Section 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall upon conviction thereof before the City Recorder or Mayor of Canby, be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not more nor to exceed one hundred dollars, or imprisonment not to exceed thirty days, or both fine and imprisonment.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that this reading be considered the first reading and was ordered posted for in the opinion of the Council the cost of publication was excessive and to come up for final passage at a regular meeting of the City Council on April 6th, 1925. at 8:00 P.M. Motion Carried.

Whereupon the following resolution was read:

BE IT RESOLVED That the City Council of Canby appreciated the work of August Rothenberg in the capacity of nightwatchman the past five years, and regrets his voluntary retirement from that position.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That a vote of thanks be extended him by this council, the same to be expressed in a letter written by the City Recorder, and being a copy of the resolution.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that the above resolution be adopted as read. Motion Carried.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that a warrant for fifteen hundred (1500.00) dollars be issued to take up electric light Bonds. Upon roll call Ayes 7. Nos 0.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that the Council adjourn. Motion Carried.
