It was moved and seconded that the bills be allowed provided the Street Suprentindent o.k.'s the bill of Mr. Self. Ayes: Bowsby; Johnson; Shull; Swanby; and Weygandt, Noes: None. Carried.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was read:

ORDINANCE NO. ¹⁹²⁴⁻³195.

An Ordinance to provide for installing meters and the rates to be charged for the uses thereof in the City of Canby.

Canby does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Meters shall be installed for any consumer of water of Canby upon filling out proper application therefore to be provided by the Superintendent of Water Works.

Section 2. Each applicant for meter shall deposit with his application the cost of installing such meter; the costs for making the water connection ow provided for in the Ordinance of Canby, and shall also deposit with the Superintendent of water works the sum of \$5.00 which \$5.00 shall be applied upon the first months water rent.

The minimum charge for meters shall be \$5.00 per calender month for which the consumer will be allowed a maximum of 25,000 gallons per calender month; excess of such amount will be as follows, for each additional 1,000 gallons or fraction thereof thereafter \$.15.

Section 3. Payments for water sefvce on meter shall be as provided in the Ordinances of Canby.

Read for the first time at a regular meeting of the Council held May 5, 1924 and to come up for final passage at a regular meeting of the Council to be held June 2, 1924 at 8:00 o'clock and ordered posted for the reason that the cost of publication was in the judgment of the council excessive.

It was moved and seconded that Ordinance be passed as its first reading and posted. Motion carried.

Whereupon the Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 135-
entitled
Section 8 was read, /as follows:

Ord. 194

An Ordinance to appeal Section 8 of Ordinance No. 135 of the City of Canby, entitled as follows:

An Ordinance providing for licensing and regulating the carrying on of certain professions, trades, calling or occupation carried on within the corporate limits of Canby, Oregon, and providing a penalty for the violating of this ordinance; and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith.

It was moved and seconded that this Ordinance be placed on its final passage, Ayes: Weygandt. Noes: Bowlsby; Johnson; Shull; and Swanby. Lost.

The City attorney was directed to open up negotiations with P. R. L. & P. Co., to run electric lines in to Canby from the North.

It was moved and seconded to adjourn to meet next Monday night at 8:00 o'clock, P. M. Carried.
