WHEREUPON the following Ordinance was read:

ORDINANCE NO 190 . 1423-3

An Ordinance providing for the payment of the California Filter Company, and declaring an emergency by which this Ordinance shall become immediately operative.

Canby does Ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas heretofore in order to supply the inhabitants of the City of Canby with pure drinking water and to prevent an epidemic of typhoid fever it was necessary to immediately secure and to have installed a filter system to provide pure water, and whereas such filter system was secured from the California Filter Company, and whereas such system has been completely installed and accepted by Canby:

Section 2. The recorder and the Mayor of the City of Canby are hereby delegated to pay in the usual manner a claim of the California Filter Company for such filtering plant and the cost of installing the same, in the amount of \$

Section 3. Insomuch as there was an urgent need

for securing such filter, and it is necessary to pay for the
same, which filter was to provide Canby with pure drinking water
and was necessary for the peace, quiet, and health of said
city, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this
Ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect upon its

adoption and approval.

Read and adopted by the Council of Canby on August 6, 1923, and ordered posted for the reason that in the judgment of the council and the cost of publication was excessive, and to come up for final passage at a special meeting of the council to be held on August 1923, at eight o'clock.

It was moved and seconded that said Ordinance be adopted as read to come up for final passage at the regular meeting of the council to be held on the 10th day of September, 1923 at 8 P. M. and ordered posted for the reason that the cost of publication was excessive in the opinion of the council. Motion carried.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that the council adjourn to meet in regular session on the second monday in September at 8:00 o'clock P. M., in lieu of the first monday in September which is a legal holiday.
