APPROVAL OF CITY BUDGET.

whereas the City known as the City of Canby, the same being situated within the limits of the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, has heretofore in the time and manner required by law submitted its proposed budget for the fiscal year January 1st, 1924 to December 31, 1924, to the Tax Supervising and Conservation Commission of the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon; and

Whereas a hearing was thereafter had of said budget before the said Tax Supervising and Conservation Commission of Clackamas County, State of Oregon, in the time and manner as by law required; and

Thereas the said Tax Supervising and Conservation Commission of said County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, has carefully considered said proposed budget:

Now Therefore be it Resolved by the said Tax
Supervising and Conservation Commission of said County of
Clackamas, State of Oregon, that the said proposed budget
of the said city, known as the City of Canby, be and the
same is hereby, by unamimous vote, allowed in the following

Whereupon the City Attorney reported that notices had been given for the sale of the property upon which there are delinquent assessments, to-wit: Lot 1 and 2 and the Easterly half of Lots 3, divided by a line parallel to A. Street all in Canby, and that such sale had been duly held on the 1st day of December at the hour of 10:30 o'clock A. M. by public auction and that said property had hot been sold for want of bidders.

Whereupon the City Attorney tendered and there was duly filed report of the City Recorder, to-wit:

Whereupon the following Resulution was read:
RESOLUTION.

Whereas the City Recorder has duly reported to the Mayor and the Council of the City of Canby that he had since the last regular meeting of the City Council advertized for sale the following described real property, topwit:

Lots 1 and 2 and the Easterly half of Lot 3, divided by a line parallel to A. Street all in Block 1 of the original townsite of Canby, according to the duly recorded plat thereof.

That the Recorder attended such sale at the time and place set and duly offered the said property for sale and received no bids therefore and that such property remains unsold.

Be it therefore resolved by the council of the City of Canby that the lims of the City of Canby against Lotsl and 2 and the easterly half of Lots 3, divided by a line parallel to A Street in Block 1 of the original townsite of Canby, according to the duly recorded plat thereof, be foreclosed by a suit in equity in the Circuit Court for Clackamas County and that the City attorney be directed to proceed with such foreclosure.

Be it further resolved that whereas it is necessary in order to protect the credit of the City of Canby and that this resolution go into immediate force and effect to preserve the peace, health and safety of the City upon its adoption by the council and approval by the Mayor.

Motion made that such resolution be adopted as read. On Roll call: Ayes: Bowlsby, Dedman, Bair, Sheldon, Shull and Weygandt. Noes: None.

Whereupon the Mayor declared such Resolution adopted and approved a copy thereof.

Whereupon the following Ordinance was read:

ORDINANCE NO 1912 1912 1912 5

An Ordiance to provide for a tex levy for the City of Canby for the year 1924 and declaring an emergency.

Section 1. "hereas the City of Canby has submitted its budget to the Tax Conservation Commission of
Clackamas County and its budget has been approved.

Section 2. That there is hereby levied a tax on all of the real and personal property taxable within the City of Canby in Clackamas County, Oregon, during the year 1924 which shall be collected on the roll known as the tax roll of 1923 and which taxes shall be collected

by the tax collector of Clackamas County in the manner provided by law and in the sum of \$4610.00.

Section 3. Whereas it is necessary that this Ordinance be immediately passed in order that such tax levy may be collected so that the peace, health and safety of the City may be taken care of and an emergency is hereby declared and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its adoption and approval by the Mayor.

It was moved and seconded that such reading be considered the first reading of said Ordinance and that in the judgment of the Council the cost of publication thereof would be excessive and the same shall be posted to come up for final passage at a Special meeting of the Council to be held on December 27, 1923. Carried.
