SPECIAL MEETING OF CITY COUNCIL, HELD ON FEB. 23, 1922, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CANVASSING VOTES OF ELECTION OF FEB. 21, 1922.

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor.

Those present were: W. S. Maple, Mayor, C. L.

Eid, Recorder, Geo. F. Meeks, Chief of Police. Councilmen:

Evans, Johnson, Sheldon, Sandsness and Shull.

The Election Returns of the Special Election of the City of Canby, held on February 21, 1922, were canvassed by the Council, and the Mayor then made the following proclamation:

I, W. S. Maple, Mayor of Canby, Clackamas County, Oregon, do hereby proclaim and declare that an Act entitled:

To Adopt an addition to the Charter of Canby by the addition thereto of Chapter 16, which Charter is entitled as follows:

"An Act to incorporate Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon; fixing the boundaries thereof; providing for the election and appointment of its officers, defining their qualifications, their duties; their powers; and fixing their terms of office; providing for the organization of the City Council, the manner of the passage of ordinances, the establishment or alteration of the grade of any street or alley and for the improvement thereof; the building and repair of sidewalks, the laying out and establishing of sewer districts, and the construction of sewers and drains therein, the levying and collecting of assessments and the re-assessments for the cost of improvements of streets and alleys and the construction of sewers and drains; providing for a docket of city liens, for the sale and redemption of property on account of delinquent assessments, for the condemnation of property for public use, for the issuance of bonds, for the owning, building and maintaining of water works for the said city; for the raising and expenditure of public money; for the liability of Canby, validating the past acts of Canby, fixing the terms of office of the present officials, and repealing all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith."

Submitted to the legal voters of Canby, Clackamas
County, State of Oregon, for their adoption or rejection at
a Special City Election held on Tuesday, February 21, 1922,
filed in the office of the Recorder on January 26, 1922, which

was proposed, adopted and ordered submitted to the legal voters of Canby by the Council of Canby, on January 26, 1922, as follows:

"Amendment to the Charter of Canby by the addition of Chapter 16, providing for a bond issue, and that Canby shall own and operate a municipal electric light system.

"Purpose--Shall Camby issue bonds in an amount not to exceed Ten thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, which shall draw interest at a rate not to exceed six (6) per cent; providing for an annual levy to pay the interest and principal? The money derived from such bond sale to be used for the purpose to construct, buy, condemn, purchase or sell a municipal transmission and distributing electric system for Canby, and authorizing the Council to operate such system."

I find that the votes cast thereon at said Special City Election were: total number of votes cast: 204; total number of votes cast for said act 152; total number of votes against said act: 51; defective ballots thrown out: 1; majority of votes for said act: 101.

I therefore proclaim and declare said Act duly adopted, approved and passed by the legal voters of Canby, as a part of the Charter of Canby.
