CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The discharge, firing or use of firecrackers, rockets, torpedoes, Roman candles, or other fireworks or substances designed and intended for pyrotechnic
display, and of pistols, canes, cannons, or other appliances
using blank cartridges or caps containing chlorate of potash
mixture, is hereby prohibited. Provided, that the mayor or
council may order the public display of fireworks by properly
qualified individuals. Provided also, that such display or
displays shall be of such a character and so located, discharged
or fired as, in the opinion of the chief of the fire department,
shall not be hazardous to surrounding property or endanger any
person or persons.

Section. 2. The sale of fireworks at retail is prohibited. The chief of the fire department may, at his discretion, remove or have removed, at the owner's expense, all stocks of fireworks or other combustibles exposed for sale, or held in stock in violation of this ordinance.

Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation, violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than twenty five dollars (\$25.00) for each day's neglect of compliance.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts or ordinances in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

It was moved and seconded that said ordinance be posted for the reason that the cost of publication was considered excessive by the Council and to come up for final passage at a special meeting to be held on Any 7,1922 1922, at eight o'clock P. M. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the \$60.00 for Mr. J. H. Cain's franchise and rescinding same. On roll call: Ayes: Bair, Dedman, Johnson, Sandsness, Sheldon and Shull. Noes: Lee.

No further business appearing, the meeting adjourned.
