Special Meeting of the Council was called to order by the Mayor, due notice of the time and place and purpose of meeting having been given to all the Councilmen.

On roll call the following officers were present:
The Mayor, W. S. Maple; City Attorney, Philip Hammond, and
Councilmen, Eid, Shull, Sandsness, Evans, Bair, Dedman and Slyter.

Motion made and seconded, that the City Attorney act as temporary Recorder. Carried.

Whereupon the following Resolution was read:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

whereas, The Council of the City of Canby deems it expedient and necessary to improve,

E Street from the center line of First Street
to the westerly line of Second Street, by
grading, draining, shouldering and paving with hard surface
pavement 16 feet in width and by doing such other work as will
be necessary to make a full and complete improvement at an
approximate cost, according to the City Surveyor's estimates,
of \$1941.12 and

WHEREAS, it has heretofore required from the City Surveyor plans and specifications and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof; and

WHEREAS, The City Surveyor has heretofore filed such plans, specifications and estimates in the office of the Recorder; and

WHEREAS, the Council has examined and found such plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY that it is hereby declared to be its intention to improve

E Street from the center line of First Street to the westerly line of Second Street by grading, draining, shouldering and paving with hard surface pavement 16 feet in width and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Surveyor's Plans, Specifications and Estimates for the aforesaid proposed improvement are hereby declared to be satisfactory and are hereby approved and adopted, which said Plans, Specifications and Estimates are on file in the office of the City Recorder and are there subject to inspection; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution of the Council declaring its purpose to improve the aforesaid Street shall be kept of record in the office of the Recorder and shall be posted by posting three copies thereof in public places in Canby, at least fifteen days before the time set as the last day on which remonstrances against the said proposed improvement may be filed, the cost of publication of such notice being excessive in the opinion of the Council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That within fifteen days after the posting of this Resolution the resident owners or their agents representing property to be improved abutting upon said street, or the part thereof proposed to be improved, which said property is to be assessed for the cost of said proposed improvement, may make and file with the Recorder a written remonstrance against the proposed improvement, ("owner" as herein used shall be construed to mean the legal title holder and "abutting property" shall be construed to mean between the street and center of the block; in blocks having an alley parallel with the streets "abutting!" shall mean to the line of the alley nearest to the street, and in tracts not laid out in blocks "abutting" shall mean within a line 100 feet back from the street" which said remonstrance will be considered by the Council at its next meeting after the expiration of the said fifteen days from the day of posting, and which meeting is set for June 16, 1921, at five o'clock P. M.

Whereupon, the following Resolution was read:

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

. WHEREAS, The Council of the City of Canby deems it expedient and necessary to improve

D Street from the Easterly line of First Street to the westerly line of Second Street by grading, draining, shouldering and paving with hard surface pavement 16 feet in width and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement at an approximate cost according to the City Surveyor's estimates, of \$1732.00; and

Whereas, it has heretofore required from the City

Surveyor plans and specifications and estimates of the work to be

done and the probable cost thereof; and

Whereas, the City Surveyor has heretofore filed such plans, specifications and estimates in the office of the Recorder; and

Whereas, the Council has examined and found such plans, specifications and estimates to be satisfactory; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CANBY, that it is hereby declared to be its intention to improve

D Street from the easterly line of First Street to the westerly line of Second Street, by grading, draining, shouldering and paving with hard surface pavement 16 feet in width, and by doing such other work as will be necessary to make a full and complete improvement, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Surveyor's Plans, Specifications and Estimates for the aforesaid proposed improvement are hereby declared to be satisfactory and are hereby approved and adopted, which said Plans, Specifications and Estimates are on file in the office of the City Recorder and are there subject to inspection; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution of the Council declaring its purpose to improve the aforesaid Street shall be kept of record in the office of the Recorder and shall be posted, by posting three copies thereof in public places in Canby, at least fifteen days before the time set as the last day on which remonstrances against the said proposed improvement may be filed, the cost of publication of such notice being excessive in the opinion of the Council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that within fifteen days after the posting of this Resolution the resident owners, or their agents representing property to be improved abutting upon said street, or the part thereof proposed to be improved, which said property is to be assessed for the cost of said proposed improvement, may make and file with the Recorder a written remonstrance against the proposed improvement, ("owner" as herein used shall be construed to mean the legal title holder and "abutting property" shall be construed to mean between the street and center of the block; in blocks having an alley parallel with the streets "abutting" shall mean to the line of the alley nearest to the street and in tracts not laid out in blocks "abutting" shall mean within a line 100 feet back from the street" which said remonstrance will be considered by the Council at its next meeting after the expiration of the said fifteen days from the day of posting, and which meeting is set for June 16, 1921, at five o'clock P. M.

Motion made that said resolution be adopted: On roll call: Ayes: Eid, Shull, Sandsness, Evans, Bair, Dedman and Slyter. None:

Whereupon the Mayor declared said Resolution adopted and immediately approved the copy thereof.
