SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL HELD NOVEMBER 23, 1921.

The meeting was called to order by W. S. Maple, Mayor.

On roll call the following officers were present:

Whereupon the following ordinance was read, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE providing for the issuance of Improvement Bonds of the City of Canby, Oregon, in the sum of \$18,805.31; providing and approving the form of the bonds to be issued and the coupons attached thereto; providing for the advertisement and sale of said bonds and declaring an emergency."

Attached to said ordinance was the following Affidavit of Posting:

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that said reading be considered the second reading, and that said ordinance be adopted.

On roll call: Ayes: Dedman, Eid, Evans, Johnson, Sandsness and Shull. Noes: None.

Whereupon the Mayor declared said ordinance adopted and immediately approved a copy thereof.

Whereupon the following ordinance was read:

ORDINANCE NO. 182

An Ordinance for the purpose of levying a tax on all taxable property, both real and personal, within Canby and declaring an emergency.

CANBY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Council of the City of Camby does hereby levy a tax of \$4502.50 on all the taxable property, both real and personal, which is taxable for County and State purposes, within the corporate limits of Camby, which is to be collected as other taxes are collected in the State of Oregon, by the Sheriff and Tax Collector of Clackamas County, during the year 1922, with the taxes commonly known as the taxes of 1921. Said levy shall consist of \$2722.50 known as the regular City Tax and \$1780.00, special taxes heretofore approved by the voters of Canby.

Section 2. Whereas it is necessary that Camby shall raise the sum of money aforesaid to meet the expenses of the City and protect the health and safety of the inhabitants thereof, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect upon its final passage and approval by the Mayor.

It was moved and seconded, that said reading be considered the first reading, and that said ordinance be adopted, and posted for the reason that the cost of publication thereof was excessive in the opinion of the Council and to come up for final passage at a special meeting of the Council to be held on December 8, 1921. Carried.

Whereupon the meeting adjourned.
