Motion made and seconded, that said bills be allowed as read:

On roll call: Ayes: Bair, Dedman, Eid, Evans Johnson, Sheldon and Shull. Noes: None.

It was moved and seconded that the renting of the lower part of the City Hall be left to Councilman Eid, as a Committee of one to act. Carried.

Whereupon the Bids for the Improvement Bonds were opened and read. Bills were received from the First National Bank of Canby, and from Clark Kendall and Company.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that the bid of the First National Bank of Canby at par be accepted.

On roll call: Bair, Dedman, Eid, Evans, Johnson, Sheldon and Shull. Noes: None.

Whereupon it was moved and seconded that the agreement for the empletion of the issuance of the bonds and settlement of the contract with Clark Kendall and Company be left to the City Attorney. Carried.

Whereupon the following resolution was read: Whereas, the Council of the City of Canby believes that it is desirable that a municipal light and power transmission and distributing system be constructed within the City of Canby; and, Whereas, it is necessary that the City Charter be amended to provide necessary funds therefore:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Canby that the following amendment to the Charter of Canby be proposed and submitted to the legal voters of Canby by this Resolution of the Council of Canby without any initiative petition, said election to be held on date to be set by the Council, for resolution, hereafter more than sixty days from date of filing this charter amendment, and that this Resolution shall upon its adoction by the Council of Canby be marked by the Recorder filed as such proposed amendment to the Charter of Canby, and that the Recorder of Canby shall cause to be printed and distributed a sufficient number of copies of said proposed amendment to said Charter as may be necessary to distribute to the voters of Canby, and that notice be given by publication. That the Recorder shall give due notice of such election, and cause to be prepared the necessary ballot, notices and other matters for such election, and that the judges and clerks of such election shall be chosen by the Council hereafter, which Charter is entitled as follows:

"An act to incorporate Canby, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon; fixing the boundaries therof; providing for the election and appointment of its officers; defining their qualifications their duties, their powers; and fixing their terms of office; providing for the organization of the City Council, the manner of the passage of ordinances, the establishment or alteration of the grade of any street or alley and for the improvement therof, the building and repair of sidewalks, the laying out and establishing sewer districts and the construction of sewers and drains therein, the levying and collecting of assessments and the re-assessments for the cost of improvements of streets and alleys and the construction of sewers and drains; providing for a docket of City Liens, for the sale and redemption of property on account of delinquent assessments, for the condemnation of property for public

use, for the issuance of bonds, for the owning, building and maintaining of wate works for the said City; for the raising and expenditure of public money; for the liability of Canby; validating the past acts of Canby; fixing the terms of office of the present officials, and repealing all acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith"

together with amendments therto; by the addition of Chapter 16.

Section 183. Canby is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and sell bonds of the City in a sum not to exceed Ten thousand dollars, bearing interest not to exceed six per centum per annum, and the Council of Canby is hereby directed to levy annually hereafter a tax on all taxable property in Canby in such an amount so that the same will provide the sum of Five hundred Dollars per annum on the principal and the further sum that will be required to be paid as interest during such year on the bonds issued as provided for in this Section of the Charter of Canby until the whole sum of said bonds, including principal and interest has been fully paid and which tax shill be used solely for the purpose of paying the principal and interest upon said bonds; said tax shall be an addition to any other tax levied by the Council of Canby or provided for or limited by any provision of the Charter of Canby, and provided further, that said bonds may be paid at any time after two years from the date on which they are issued, upon thirty days notice being given by the Treasurer of Canby-previous to any interest date. The further terms and conditions under which these bonds shall be issued, shall be provided by Ordinance or Resolution adopted by the Council of Canby.

Section 184. The Council of Canby is hereby granyed the power, in addition to all other powers heretofore granted by the Charter of Canby, to construct, build, maintain,
buy, condemn, purchase or sell a transmission and distributing
system for a municipal electric light and power system for
Canby, for the purpose of furnishing Canby, its inhabitants
or such other persons as may be supplied thereby; and further
to buy, manufacture and sell such electrical energy as may be
needed, used or supplied by such transmission or distributing
system; and further, to do all such things as may be necessary
or needful to carry into effect the powers granted by this
Chapter of the Charter, which power shall be exercised by Resolution or Ordinance, and that the Council shall thereby
make all provisions or regulations that may be required for the
full exercise of the powers herein granted, so as to carry on
and conduct such business.

Section 185. The funds received under the sale of the bonds provided for under Section 183, shall be expended under the direction of the Council of Canby, to construct, build, buy, condemn, or purchase such transmission and distributing electric system mentioned in this Chapter.

It was moved and seconded that said Resolution be adopted as read: On roll call: Ayes: Bair, Dedman, Eid, Evans, Johnson, Sheldon and Shull. Noes: None.

Whereupon the Mayor immediately approved a copy thereof and declared said Resolution in full force and effect, and the Recorder announced that a copy of the Charter Amendment had been duly filed in the Recorder's office as of December 5, 1921.

Section 184. The Council of Canby is hereby granted the power, in addition to all other powers heretofore granted by the Charter of Canby, to construct, build, maintain, buy, condemn, purchase or sell a transmission and distributing system for a municipal electric light and power system for Canby, for the purpose of furnishing Canby, its inhabitants or such other persons as may be supplied thereby; and further, to buy, manufacture and sell such electrical energy as may be needed, used or supplied by such transmission or distributing system; and further, to do all such things as may be necessary or needful to carry into effect the powers granted by this Chapter of the Charter, which power shall be exercised by Resolution or Ordinance, and that the Council shall thereby make all provisions or regulations that may be required for the full exercise of the powers herein granted, so as to carry on and conduct such business.

Section 185. The funds received under the sale of the bonds provided for under Section 183, shall be expended under the direction of the Council of Canby, to construct, build, buy, condemn, or purchase such transmission and distributing electric system mentioned in this Chapter.

It was moved and seconded that said Resolution be adopted as read: On roll call: Ayes: Dedman, Eid, Evans, Johnson, Sandsness, Sheldon and Shull. Noes: None.

Whereupon the Mayor immediately approved a copy thereof and declared said Resolution in full force and effect, and the Recorder announced that a copy of the Charter Amendment had been duly filed in the Recorder's office as of January 26, 1922.

To comply with the Budget Law the General Fund has been transferred to Bond Retiring Funds #1 and 2. However, the General Fund owed the Water Fund the sum of \$310.70 and on December 31, the Treasurer was informed by the Recorder that there were outstanding and not presented warrants in the amount of \$57.82 on the General Fund making a total of \$368.52.

A further deduction of the Treasurer's fees for the year 1921 was made from this fund, the treasurer's fees are one-half of one per cent of the money's handled during the term of the Treasurer. The present term started on January 1, 1921, and the funds handled are as follows: RECEIPTS:

The money in Bond Retiring Funds Nos. 1 and 2, is for principal only; the interest for these bond issues being transferred from the General Fund. No bonds of these issues can be retired until ten years from the date of the issue, which will be 1926.
