

Regular meeting of City Council,  
Canby, Oregon February 7th, 1921.

Council met in regular session and called to order at 8 o'clock P.M. by Mayor W.S. Maple, there were present Mayor W.S. Maple, Recorder C.L. Eid, Marshall Geo. F. Meeks, City Attorney P.L. Hammond and councilmen Bair, Eid, Evans, Johnson, Sandsness and Shull. Councilmaens Dedman and Slyter being absent.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved as read.

Marshall Geo. F. Meeks reported that several of the street light brackets were loose and needed repairing. Mr Robinson spoke and suggested that this matter be put off for awhile as he intended to make some repairs a little later on.

The Canby Co-operative Mutual Telephone Co. made a complaint that some of the electric wires were down on the telephone wires. It was moved and seconded that this be referred to the committee on Streets and Public Property. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the committee Streets and Public Property canvass the radius around the city pumping plant to ascertain the depths of cess pools. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the water collection be turned over to the Water Superintendent for collections and that he shall receive the 5% compensation. Motion carried.

Mr M. J. Lee spoke in behalf of the citizens that were living in the edge of the City Limits, who were wanting City water, stating that as they were tax payers to the City of Canby that they should be entitled to the benefits thereof.

It was suggested by the Mayor that the City Marshall should enforce the Dog Ordinance.

The Council proceeded to ballot for the election for a Street Superintendent. Result of the first ballot Thos. B. Hamilton 5, Harry Gilmore 1, whereupon the Mayor declared Thos. B. Hamilton duly elected Street Superintendent.

There being no further business the Council adjourned.
